Beware! of poisonous plants


By late summer, many of our wild plants have come into fruit, often with useful and tasty results. But if you plan to add a little variety to your diet by experimenting with edible wild plants, a few words of caution are in order. Even some relatively common and attractive plants can result in poisonings that are extremely uncomfortable, or sometimes fatal.

For example, both the seeds and wilted leaves of Canada yew, or ground hemiock, contain a poisonous alkaloid that can cause death due to respiratory failure. The red pulpy berries of this low-spreading evergreen are attractive to children. and yew leaves have sometimes been mistaken for eastern hemlock, which makes a pleasant tea.
