

# "Yes" to no nukes vote buttons at fall fairs

Buttons promoting a Yes vote in the nuclear disarmament referendum will be sold at both the Georgetown and Acton Fall Fairs this month for donations of \$1 or more.

Last Tuesday night the Acton Georgetown group pushing for a yes vote in the referendum in this year's municipal election met at the home of Eldon Comfort,

RR 4, Acton. This group of concerned citizens lobbied Halton Hills council to hold the referendum in conjunction with the November 8 municipal vote "so that concerned citizens would have the opportunity to express their wills on this life and death issue," Comfort said.

Details were finalized for a poster crusade for

elementary and high school students and letters for the guidance of principals allotted for distribution.

These posters will be put up in public places in Acton and Georgetown prior to the vote.

Children up to grade five are urged to do posters dealing with the theme "The Kind of World I'd Like to Grow Up In." For grades six

to eight the theme is "Save the World for Me, Please" and high school poster theme is "Vote Yes for Disarmament." Completed posters should be taken to Halton Hills Furniture

and Appliances in Acton or Penniesworth or J.V. Clothing in Georgetown as well as 52 Metcalfe Cr. or 61 Charles St. Students can also call 877-1994. Posters should be completed and

turned in by October 13.

Letters to all churches and service clubs in Halton Hills were divided among members of the group for early delivery. These institutions are being invited to participate in promoting the Yes vote and to contribute to the cost of a full page ad in local papers.

Plans to operate booths at both the Acton and Georgetown fairs were also finalized. Literature will be handed out at the fairs and buttons given out in return for donations of \$1 or more.

The next meeting of the group will be held in Georgetown on September 28.

## Beware! of poisonous plants

By late summer, many of our wild plants have come into fruit, often with useful and tasty results. But if you plan to add a little variety to your diet by experimenting with edible wild plants, a few words of caution are in order. Even some relatively common and attractive plants can result in poisonings that are extremely uncomfortable, or sometimes fatal.

For example, both the seeds and wilted leaves of Canada yew, or ground hemlock, contain a poisonous alkaloid that can cause death due to respiratory failure. The red pulpy berries of this low-spreading evergreen are attractive to children, and yew leaves have sometimes been mistaken for eastern hemlock, which makes a pleasant tea.

Colorful berries can often lead to

poisoning, since they attract the appetite of curious youngsters. The red berries of lily-of-the valley, a common garden plant, are poisonous. So are the red or white berries, often known as doll's eyes which are a common inhabitant of deciduous woods. The red clusters of berries on deadly nightshade have low toxicity for adults, but are a serious danger to children.

Other parts of plants can also be poisonous. The horse-chestnut, a commonly-planted shade tree, has poisonous nuts. Similarly, the pea-like pods of the black locust tree are inedible. So are all parts of the Jack-in-the-pulpit, including the corn-like roots.

If you or your child accidentally swallow a plant or berry that causes a severe reaction, your first contact should be your local poison control centre, which is listed prominently in the front of your phone book.

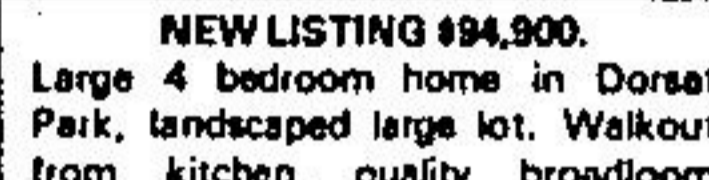

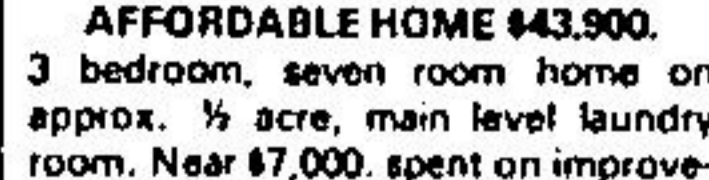

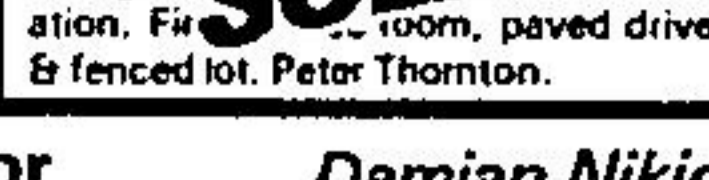
