

# Smoke still swirls at council chamber

The smoke will continue to swirl around the council chamber despite pleas from Councillors Marilyn Serjeantson, and Pam Sheldon for a ban on smoking until the end of the term.

Serjeantson asked that the ban be effective at council meetings only, exempting committee meetings, which would have meant at two meetings a month smokers would have had to refrain. She described it as a "nice gesture from some to others."

Councillor Ross Knechtel said he was sympathetic to people who are bothered by smoke, but said he is not in favor of passing legislation for items which are not legal problems. He said it should happen because people are concerned about others.

Sheldon told Councillors Mike Armstrong and Harry Levy she resented sitting between them, both smokers, since smoke affects her health. "I leave here with a headache every night," she said.

Councillor Walter Blehn jokingly suggested the ruling should be just one person can

light up at a time. He said while he was now a non-smoker he had smoked for years and years. Councillor Dave Whiting pointed out even the Medical Officer of Health, who is fervently against smoking, advised leaving smoking a voluntary decision at regional council.

After the vote was taken with only Serjeantson and Sheldon for the non-smoking ban, Mayor Peter Pomeroy said he hoped that was the last time the issue was raised. He pointed out council had spent half an hour on the subject, more than frequently is spent on more important matters.

# No action on petition
