The Acton Chamber of Commerce and new North Halton Tourism Association are interested in acquiring through the Town the old Stone School vacated by St. Joseph's School as a museum for Acton.

President of the Chamber of Commerce, told council Monday night the Chamber will be incorporating the Leithertown logo and movement back under the Chamber once again.

He called on Town staff to keep both the Chamber and Tourism Association appraised about municipal-school board negotiations for the Stone School once it is declared surplus by the board. He said both organizations are interested in acquiring the building for a museum for Acton through the Town.
