

Garbage Disposal

Past studies cost \$800,000

The latest study on garbage disposal sites in Halton will cost approximately \$187,000 plus, Halton Chief Administrative Officer Dennis Perlin told Halton Hills council, Monday night.

He admitted before this study even starts, \$800,000 has already been spent on studies, and hearings, then stated "We are looking at \$1 million

before we spend another \$2 or \$3 million on a land fill site."

Mayor Pete Pomeroy explained all solid waste projects are now under the Environmental Assessment Act, "so we are back at square one." He predicted there could be a lot more costs involved and emphasized the Burlington landfill site which

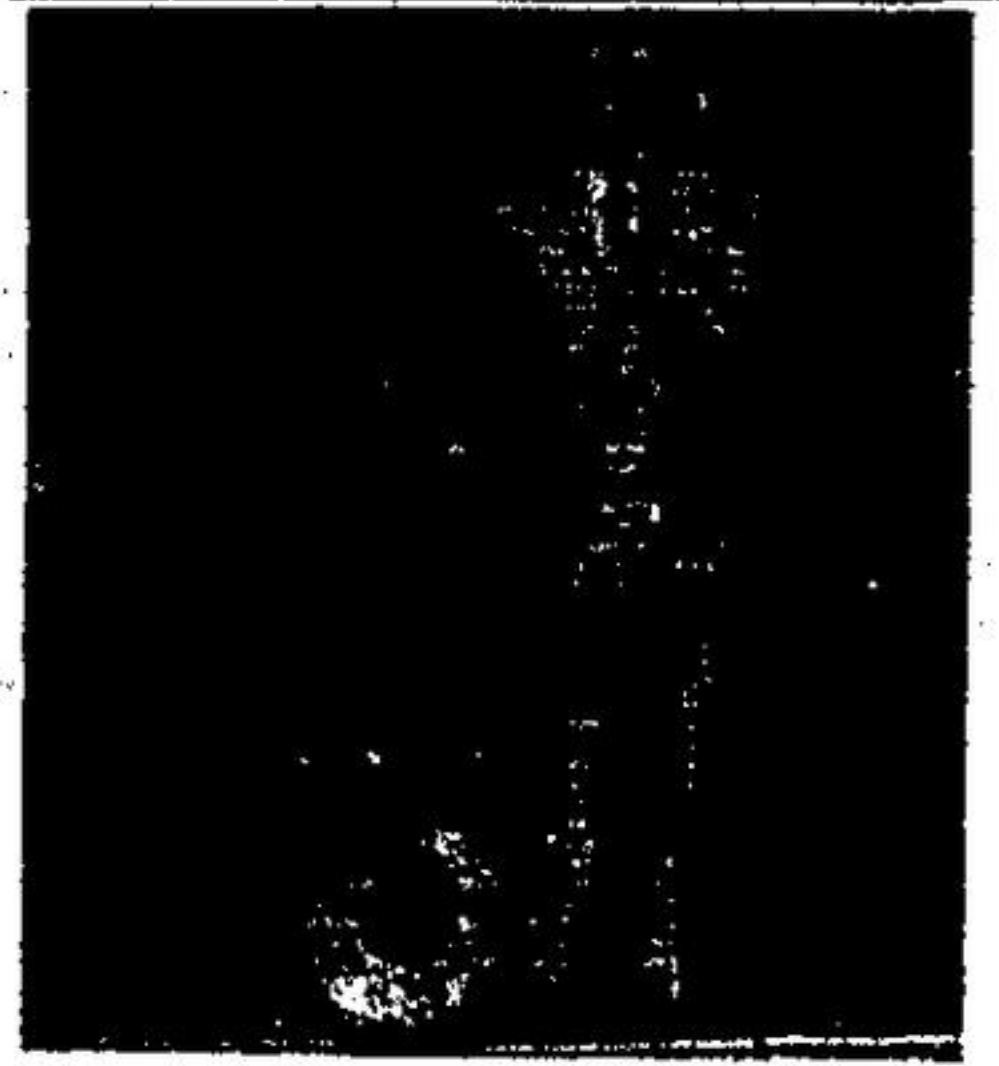
serves this area is expected to be full by March 1984.

Perlin pointed out the Walker, Wright, and Young Associates Ltd. bid was reasonable compared to the highest bid of \$450,000.

The study will consider all possible garbage disposal sites in Halton not only Site F.

Driver's sentence to be appealed for accident in which ex-Actonian killed

The Crown appeal of the sentence handed down to a Burlington man who pleaded guilty to a charge of careless driving in connection with a 1980 accident in which three women, including former Acton and Esqueping resident Lorraine Robertson (nee Lavigne) were killed, will be heard in provincial court.

A Justice of the Supreme Court of Ontario sitting in High Court ruled recently that the Crown appeal of Walter Valente's sentence to the provincial court is the proper avenue.

The appeal had been opposed by Burlington lawyer Noel Bates representing Valente. Bates argued that the appeal had to be heard in a higher court because the sentence had been handed down by County Court Judge Thomas Quinlan. He said he did not dispute the right to appeal, but that it had to be heard in a higher court.

The Crown, represented before the High Court by Jeff Casey, of the Crown Attorney's Office in Toronto, successfully argued that Judge Quinlan had been acting as a Justice of the Peace, when he sentenced Valente, therefore the appeal to Provincial Court was justified.

Valente was given a \$200 fine and his licence was suspended for one year.

Casey said the highway traffic act allows for a maximum of a \$500 fine, six months in prison, and a two year suspension of licence. Minimum sentence is a fine of \$100.

Crown Attorney Jim Treleaven said the provincial offenses appeals court in Milton will set a date for the appeal to be heard after the papers confirming the decision are sent down from Toronto.

Appeals are heard on the third Thursday of each month said Treleaven. He expects the appeal to the Valente sentence would be heard on the October or November court dates.

Mrs. Robertson, a mother of three, was killed in the accident in July 1980 along with two other women. Two others were injured. All of the victims were riding bicycles on Plains Rd. in Burlington at the time of the mishap.

Mrs. Robertson's family ran the Cedar Springs Motel on Highway 7 for a number of years and following her marriage she moved to Church St. in Acton. A graduate of Stewarttown and Acton High

Schools, Mrs. Robertson lived in the area from 1969 to 1977. Aged 24 at the time of her death, she and her family were living in Hamilton.

Two seek Hydro seats

It is quite obvious that the reason for sickness and disease among the children of Israel was due to rebellion against the word of God. They had taken themselves out from under the protection of the old Covenant. Psalm 107:17 "Fools because of their transgression, and because of their iniquities are afflicted."
