In the Senior Boys, Bill McKenzie finished 88th in the race with 112 competitors finishing. Seniors dropped

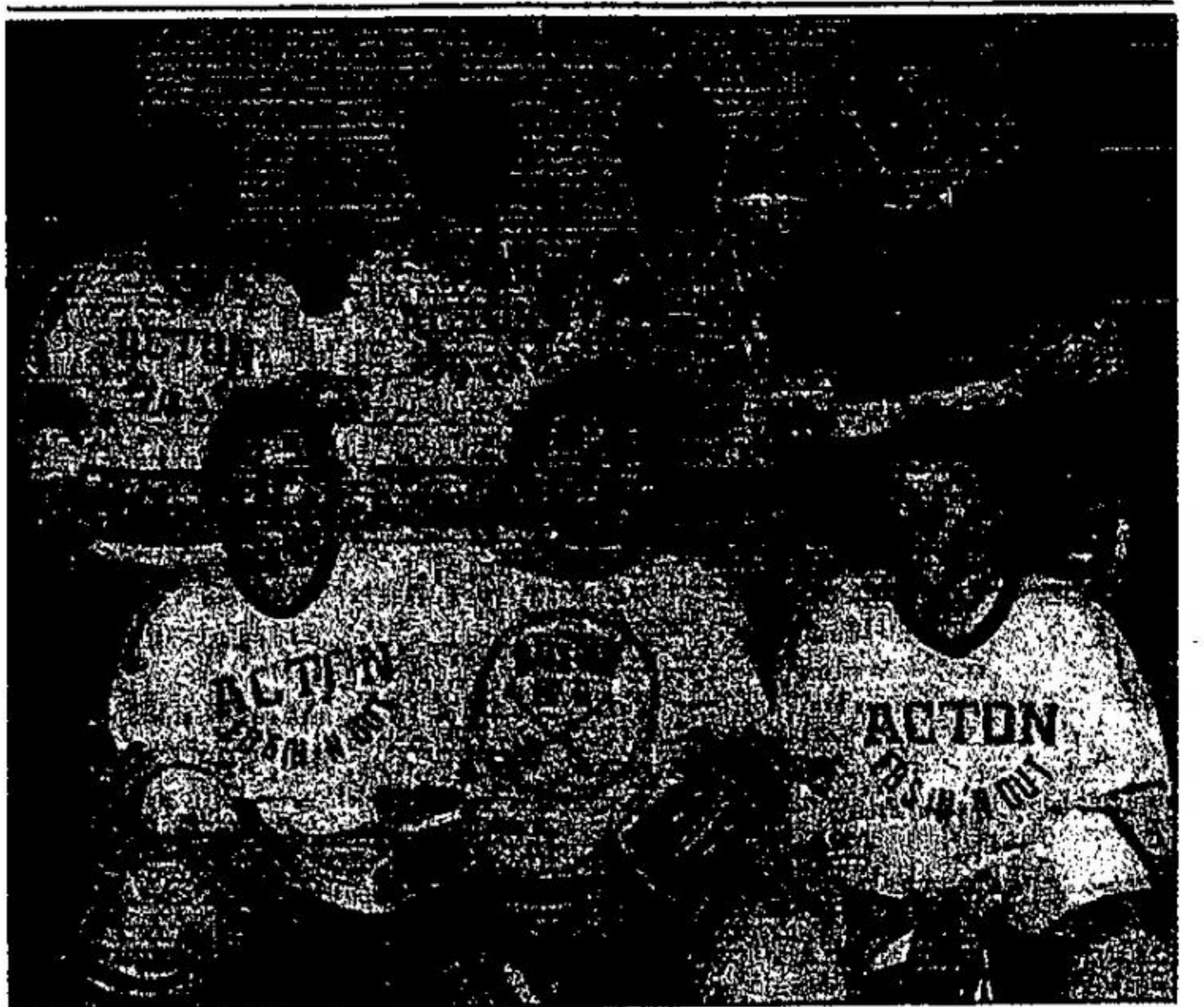
Juveniles may fold
