**Out doors**

The most productive time of the year for Ontario anglers is with us. Given a choice of time spent fishing, mid-September to early December is a way ahead in terms of time versus productivity. Bass, Pike, Pickerell and Muskegon become more aggressive in feeding habits as fall progresses, gaining fat for the long, lean, cold months.

Chinook Salmon are taking very well in Southampton. Best results are above the lower highway bridge, trolling in the ticket. Best producing lures are the Pingate, Quickfish and Jointed Eleet, all in black or skunk colors. The 377 Dominion spoon, Plain Satin Silver, is also producing well.

The main run of Salmon in the Nottawasaga River are already up at Alliston. These large Chinook can put up a great battle and break up plenty of good tackle, so go equipped for tough going. On the Great Salmon Hunt reports are very good with record catches.

Georgetown area fisherman Brent Hall, along with Bob Martin, had good luck recently, landing two good Salmon in the 13 pound class. Brent has already tackled up some exciting fish and has a previous mention for prizes in the Salmon Hunt. One of these fish was a hen or female carrying some of the nicest Credit River Candy or Roe. Great bait for late run Steehead fishing.

David Barkley-Smith of Acton has also had his share of good Salmon from The Lake Ontario Hunt. Smith specializes in smoking these large Salmon, making for wonderful eating. The sample I received would certainly make one forget that it originated in Lake Ontario.

Ed and Betty Hawes, and son Brian, recently returned from a trip to Glacier Bay, Alaska, via a cruise ship from Vancouver. According to Ed this is some of the most scenic and colorful areas to be seen in the world. They observed Harp seals, Whales, and plenty of Salmon, but had no time for fishing. It's a pity with all the great fishing waters they passed through.

Ron Lattimer of Limehouse and fellow fisherman Rocco (Butch) Colangelo of Georgetown have had a successful fishing trip to Lake St. John, landing quite a few good Pickerell and one huge 14 pound Catfish. Looks like the frying pan got a good workout, those cats are the greatest in the eating department.

Be a practising conservationist, if you are going to give it away, take a picture and let it go for another day.

Pink Salmon are running on the north shores of Lake Superior, although not in great numbers. Plenty of Chinook Salmon at Wawa are hitting well on Olympic and Mepps spinners, plus Blue and Silver Little Cleo.

No fall run of Steelhead were observed up to September 14, however I landed and released approximately 25 summer run Rainbow averaging 1 1/2 pounds. Great fighters they were, most taken on roe bags. It was a great experience, with strikes on just about every cast. It makes the trip to the north shore worthwhile even if northern Ontario service stations know just how to rip you off with prices of gasoline fluctuating wildly.

**Hot dog days live**

Hot dog days will still be allowed if a new fund raising policy is okayed by Halton Board of Education.

In a report from Ron Chapman, superintendent of special services, at the board's meeting Thursday evening, it was suggested only four fund raising events be sanctioned a year for each school. The report came about after complaints from parents last spring regarding the number of fund raising activities.

Chapman pointed out the present policy needed very little revision, only a few words needed changing.

Trustee Janis Millman, Oakville, resents hot dog days being taken away. In schools almost totally bused, hot dog days are the only times the children get a hot meal.

Chapman countered these days would still be allowed, just not for fund raising purposes.

**Snippe's welcome grandson**


