The official opening of the Artisan Village at the Hide House was a gala event as over 200 people were on hand for the ribbon cutting ceremony last Wednesday.

For many people, the Hide House was the final step on an after-

noon-long bus tour of the area, sponsored by the North Halton Tourism Association.

Shoppers may watch artisans and craftspeople at work, and even purchase their wares. Glassblowers, weavers, potters, sculptors, leather

workers, wood workers, and seamstresses and others are all on hand.

The work is all featured at the Journeyman Gallery, with special showings taking place in Excursions. The Leathertown General Store and Good Tidings, a Christmas

shop are also attractions.

John Lauchinger, Deputy Minister of Tourism of Ontario, assisted in the ribbon cutting. He pointed out people are taking shorter trips and a co-operative marketing effort enables the Hide House and the Tourism Association to take advantage of this traffic.
