Start building citadel soon

Region paying costs

Halton Region will continue to pay a share of the cost of keeping local fuveniles in private residences to which they have been committed by courts, for now.

Councillors last week making the payments for another two weeks following a recommendation from the health and social services committee.

Confusion over who pays for this care has reigned supreme since a Supreme Court of Canada decision struck down a section of the Criminal requiring local municipalities to pay a portion.

The court ruled that

the federal Parliament acted outside its authority in making such a requirement because it does not have jurisdiction over municipal governments because the issue of who pays for care has nothing to do with criminal law.

In a report to committee members, social services director Debbie Oakley said she has received verbal indications from the Ontario Ministry of Community and Social Services that they will pick up the entire cost of such care from the date of the Supreme Court decision to the end of

Currently, Halton is paying 50 per cent of the bills it receives from the operators of such residences, but only for juveniles who were in care when the decision was handed down.
