# BIA, Actario plan market, ciderfest for August '83

Actario and the Acton Business Improvement Area (BIA) are planning a big Saturday or weekend for the end of August, 1983.

This gala event will be a combination second Leathertown Market and Ciderfest. Plans for this big community event were discussed at the merchants' fall wine and cheese party last Wednesday night at Acton Family Restaurant.

Actario spokesman Ted Tyler said the BIA approved Actario's proposal, the concept of a big weekend, "in principle."

The Leathertown Market wouldn't be on Willow St. again, it would be moved to the centre of Mill St. That way the merchants could participate more in this market by having sidewalk sales and besides the event would then bring people right downtown.

The Ciderfest is a new twist, and would be unique. The timing of the Acton event would be ahead of other provincial community festivals as well.

Plans call for cabarets downtown with local licensed establishments becoming involved in running the cabarets.

Organizers don't want all the activity to be downtown either. The Becker's plaza parking lot has been pencilled in as the site for an evening outdoor dance.

Of course there'd be some kind of a parade too. People activities like races would be on tap.

There'd be lots of entertainment throughout the weekend and the organizers will even look at "rejuvenating" the successful Monte Carlo Night of 1981, Tyler said.

Terry Grubbe has volunteered to conduct a unique event. Helium filled balloons would be sold with message cards inside for a nominal fee. About 1,000 balloons would be released at once at the market and there would be prizes for the balloon message being returned from the farthest destination, the "spot" closest to Acton, etc.

It will be a very big project, Tyler observed, and so a year will be needed to plan it.

The last weekend in August was selected because most people are back from vacations then and local produce will be at its best for the market. It'd also be before other fall festivals.

Tyler said Actario will very much be involved in this project and Tyler said he "anticipates" the lottery in aid of the Town Hall continuing for some time until a "come promise" is reached with council for the building's restoration.

## Start building citadel soon

The Halton Hills Salvation Army is aiming to break ground for the new citadel on Mill St. East in Acton on November 6, if not sooner.

Envoy Doug Vale has announced Territorial Headquarters has approved the final plans for the new church which will cost about half-a-million dollars.

The project has gone to tender and the bids should be returned soon, Envoy Vale said.

He said they are hoping to break ground on the site on November 6, when the Salvation Army's Corps marks its third anniversary in Halton Hills. Celebrations of the anniversary are planned for that week.

However, there is a chance the weather and construction schedule may move the ground breaking ceremonies ahead of the November 6 celebrations.

## Region paying costs

Halton Region will continue to pay a share of the cost of keeping local juveniles in private residences to which they have been committed by the courts, for now.

Councillors last week agreed to continue making the payments for another two weeks following a recommendation from the health and social services committee.

Confusion over who pays for this care has reigned supreme since a Supreme Court of Canada decision struck down a section of the Criminal Code requiring local municipalities to pay a portion.

The court ruled that the federal Parliament acted outside its authority in making such a requirement because it does not have jurisdiction over municipal governments and because the issue of who pays for care has nothing to do with criminal law.

In a report to committee members, social services director Debbie Oakley said she has received verbal indications from the Ontario Ministry of Community and Social Services that they will pick up the entire cost of such care from the date of the Supreme Court decision to the end of 1982.

Currently, Halton is paying 50 per cent of the bills it receives from the operators of such residences, but only for juveniles who were in care when the decision was handed down.

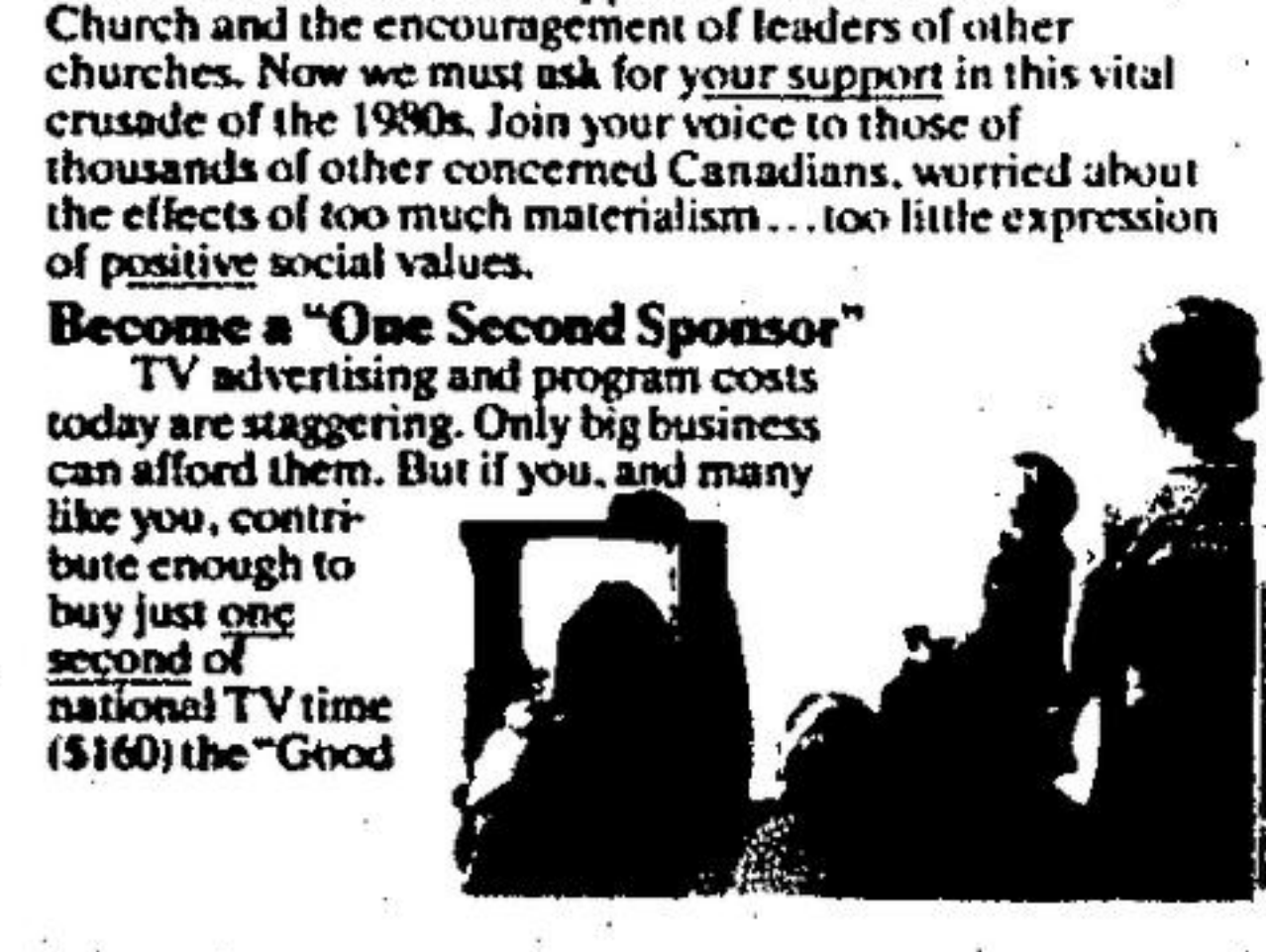
