Sunday night in Georgetown the Sabres started off slow, but finished the game strong to defeat the Gemini 8-5.

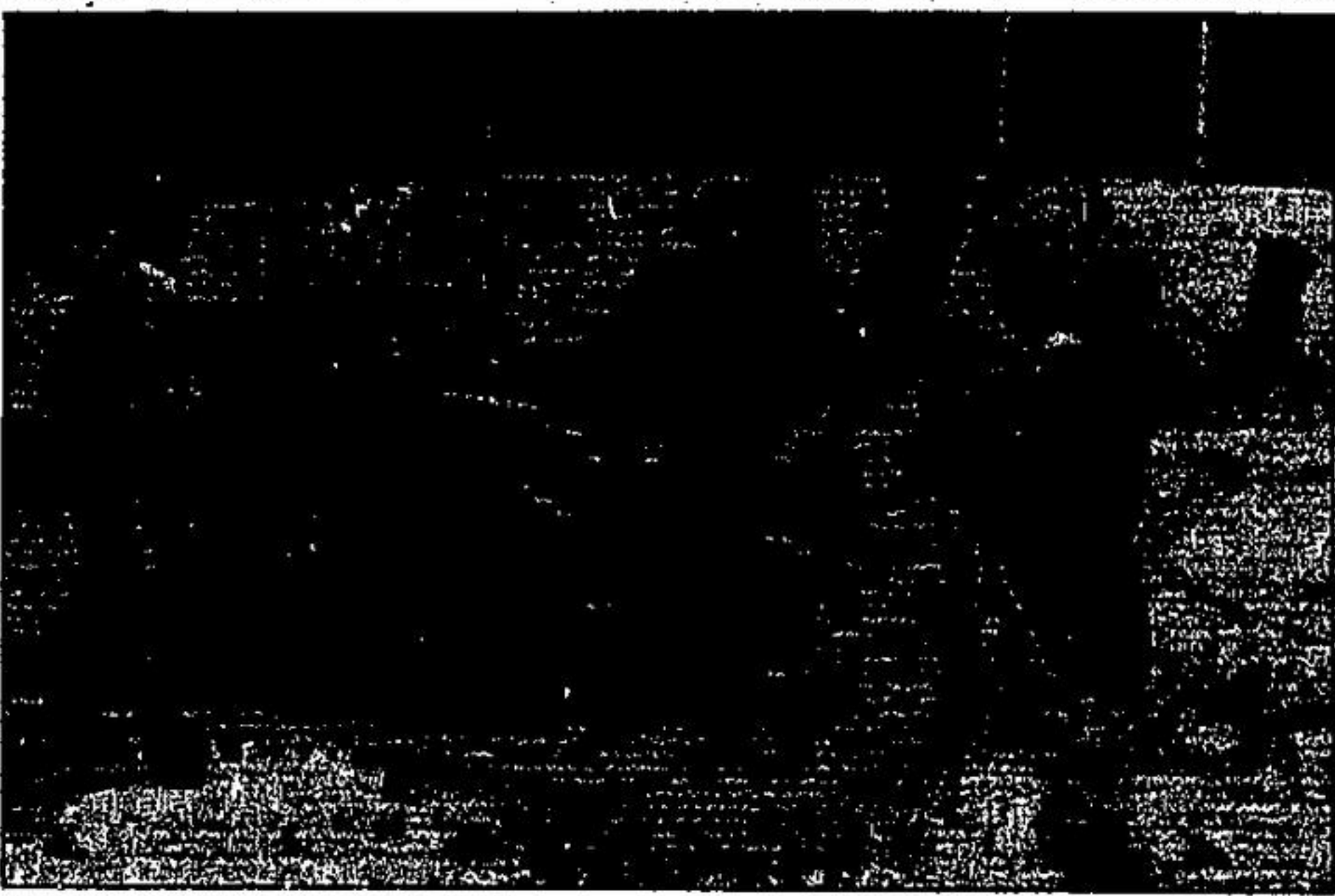
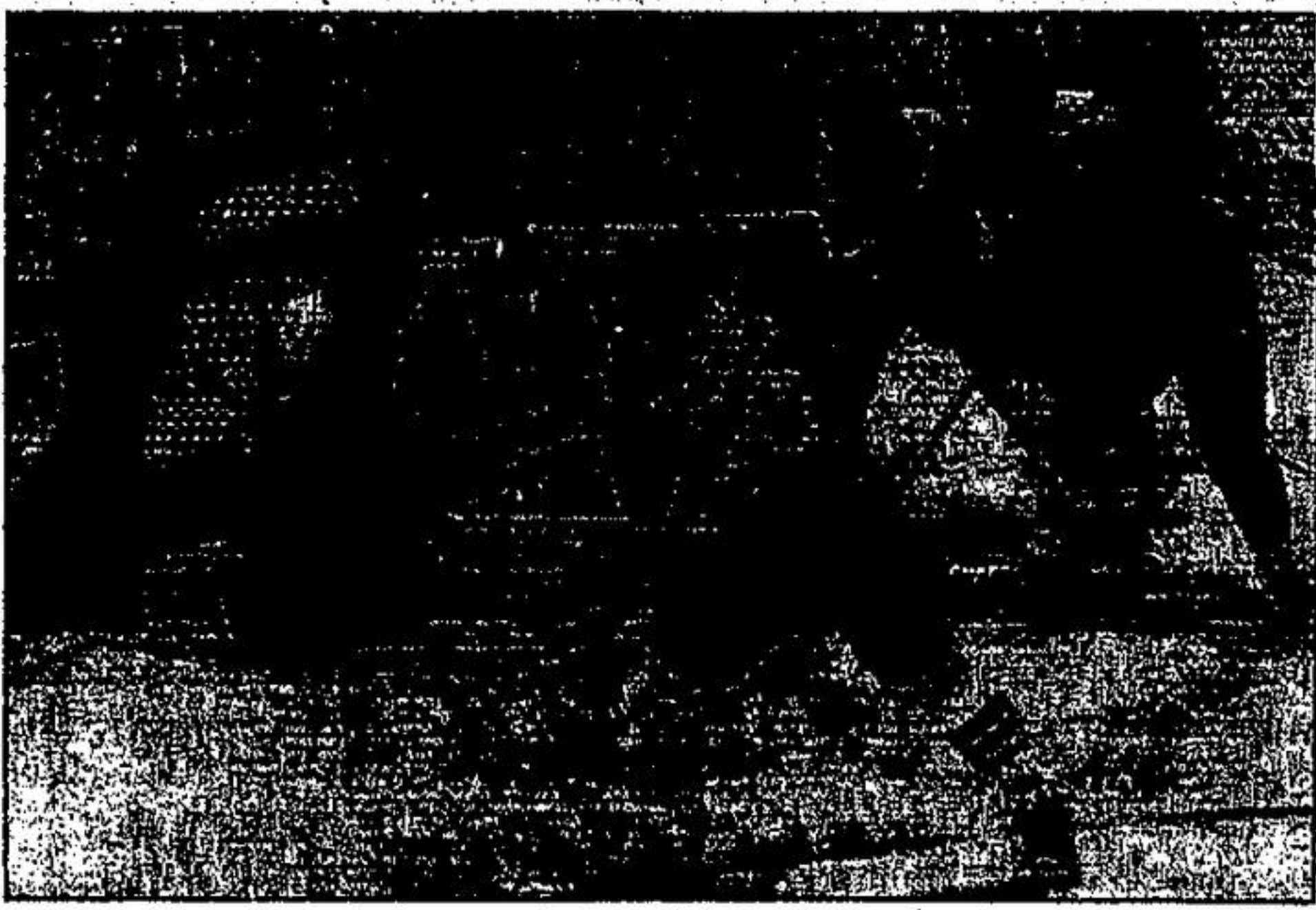
