## Sabres roar back to draw 4-4 Keating stars with two goals

On Friday night the Acton Junior "B" Sabres came back from a four goal deficit to pick up a tie with the Barrie Colts 4-4.

Barrie opened the scoring at 2:50 of the first period and while Acton was on the power play the Colts fired a short handed goal to go ahead 2-0 at the midway point of the frame. Barrie pulled ahead with a goal at the 17:00 minute mark to end the period ahead 3-0.

The Colts outshot the Sabres in the first twenty minutes 10-8.

Barrie went ahead by four at the 2:00 minute mark of the second period.

Four minutes later Jamie Morrison scored for the Sabres on a power play, assisted by Ken Franklin and Bob Boldt.

Sabres have now earned five of a possible eight points in four league outings.



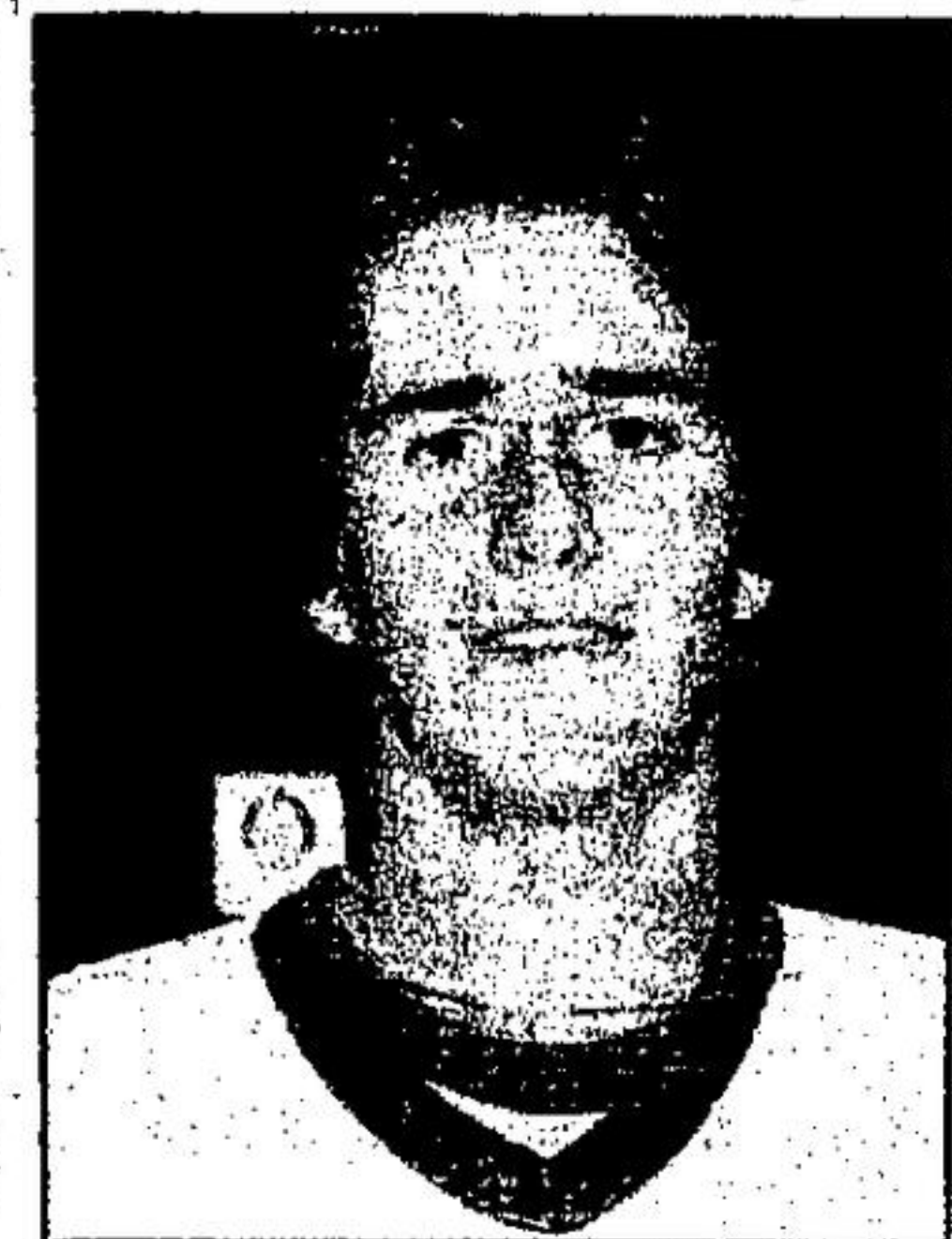
