NAMES NOT ON POLLING LIST
Any person who has qualified to have his name entered on the polling list during the period of September 7th, 1982 to September 30th, 1982 and finds that his name is not entered thereon or if the necessary forms to have his name entered during the period of corrections and additions (ending October 20th, 1982) can attend the Returning Officer's Office to secure a certificate which name to be entered at the polling station. In addition to this, qualified electors may be entitled to have their names added to the list at the polling station on polling day.
Qualified Elector means a person who during the period of September 7th, 1982 to September 30th, 1982 is a Canadian Citizen or other British Subject, a resident of Milton or a non-resident owner or tenant thereof and has attained the age of 18 years by November 8th, 1982.

PROXY VOTING
Forms are available at my office for the appointment of a voting proxy. A certificate to vote by proxy must be certified by the CLERK. This can only be done between October 19th, 1982 and up to 5:00 p.m. on Day, November 8th, 1982.
