isolation that the province did not have the courage to pass, but they have the power to force municipalities to include it in their official plans, thereby making it law.

"A nicer memory is the strong financial position of the new town, even stronger now than at its inception."

Maltby said he was retiring "with mixed emotions". He continued that he enjoyed the debate, and the fellowship of council, but would not miss all the reading. "I tell myself I will have more free time, but I know I am going to miss it."

He thanked his colleagues on council, and the municipal staff, but mainly thanked the people of Esquewaug.

Maltby pointed out when he was first elected, it was for a two year term, which the province rolled back to one year. He has always been supporting a three year term. "Now that it is a reality, it became one of my reasons for retiring."

Halton had many winners at the International Plowing Match held in Middlesex County, September 27-October 2. In the two furrow plow class for competitors aged 26 to 34 years, Barry Timbers, RR 5, Milton, placed second with Keith Leslie, RR 4, Georgetown, first in the 35 years and over age group. Keith went on to be declared Grand Champion of the two furrow classes.

Other competitors placing well for Halton were: Harley Pickering, Oakville; Paul Wilkinson, Georgetown No. 3; David Wilson Norval 1; and Wayne Cunningham, Limehouse No. 1. David and Wayne were the second highest placing team of two young plowmen from a County or Region.

All awards were presented at the Awards Banquet at Western Fairgrounds, London, on the Friday evening, October 1st, with over 1,500 in attendance. A busload of Halton plowing enthusiasts attended this event to cheer our competitors.

In the Ontario Furrow Queen competition, the winner was Sharon Salm of Waterloo. Runner-up was Elizabeth Wise, the representative from Elgin County and an employee of the United Co-operatives of Ontario store at Georgetown. Susan Livingston represented Halton, with Mrs. Spencer Wilson, Norval 1, the donor of the Trophy to the Ontario winner.

Ken Ferguson and Robert Brown from Ontario were declared

the Canadian Champion and Reserve respectively, and will compete in the World Competition in Zimbabwe in May, 1983.

On Saturday, October 3, winners of the divisions from the first four days competed for Ontario Championship honours and the right to compete in 1983 in the Canadian finals. Winner was Floyd Forsythe, with Halton plowman Barry Timbers as Reserve Champion and Keith Leslie in third place.
