Streamers For Rainbow and Salmon

The following is my answer regarding the use of streamers for taking rainbow and salmon when they are in the rivers on spawning runs.

First of all take stock of your patience, lots of it is needed to coax one of these lunkers to slurp in your offerings, if an angler hasn't patience then it's best to forget about fur—feathers and steel and tie on the old reliables, roe bags and jures.

Alaska Mary Ann

My best luck was had on the Polar Bear Streamer tied on a size 2 long shank hook with a straight eye. An American who saw this fly in one of my 8 pound rainbows informed us that it's known as the Alaska Mary Ann in US angling chatter.

The dressing is as follows: Tail bright red rooster hackle fronds, ribbing medium wide silver tinsel wrapped over medium white chenille, throat hackle same as tail, wing, polar bear hair, tie this in using two lots, use zero size thread to bind them down with and be sure and use ample head cement to anchor the butts of the hair. The hair should come to the end of the tail. A finer thread can be used to tie in the cheek dressing and taper off the head.

Now take a small fine file and sharpen up the hook point and finish with a fine stone. The above streamer works very well after dark in a pool that other anglers have left. The quarry you are after move at dark so keep The Mary Ann in the water and not in the air for a tight line.

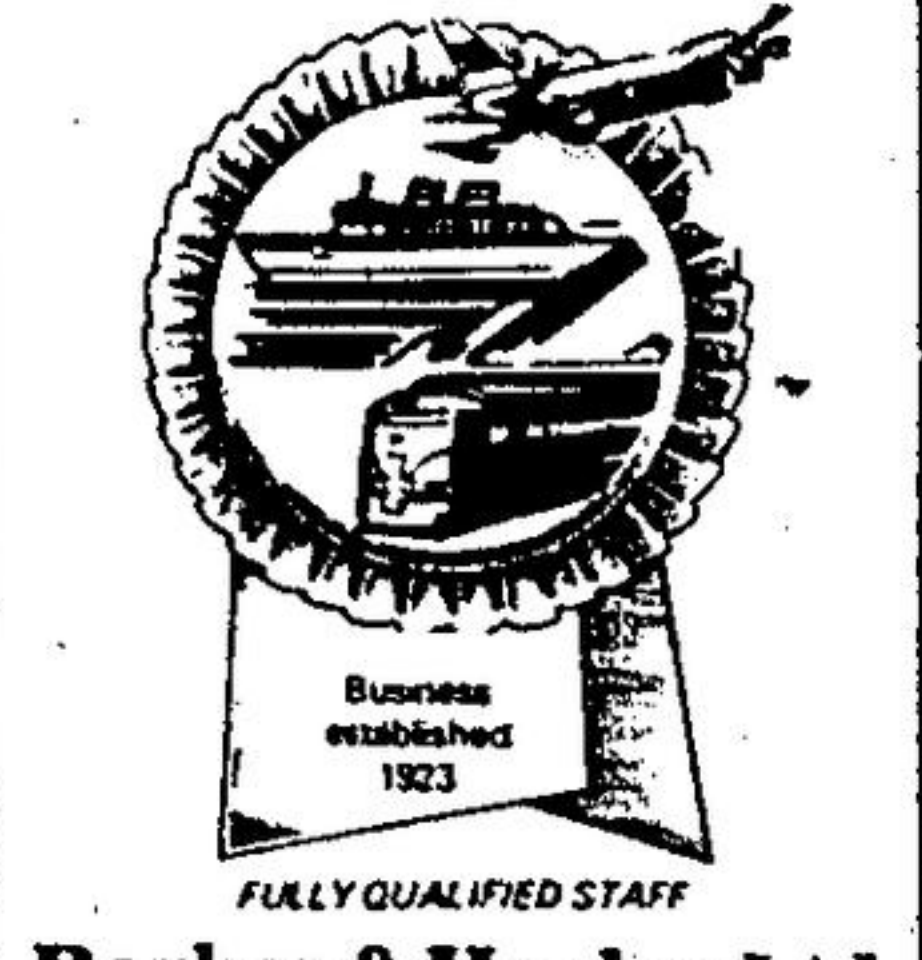
