**Sale of property policy is revised**

A change in the sale of surplus school property will result in more money going into the Halton Board of Education coffers.

In the past, Georgetown Trustee Betty Fisher pointed out, if the school board sold the town property, it was charged 70 per cent of the market value. However, she explained, the provincial government in turn gets almost 50 per cent of that money because they helped fund the original building of the school.

Taxpayers now will be paying more for the school properties on their municipal taxes, while the balance will be a credit in the board's bank account. Mrs. Fisher noted the taxpayers are going to pay for it in one way or another. Now, she said, it will be through their municipal taxes rather than school board.

Burlington representative Elaine Riehm, at Thursday's meeting stated, "it doesn't make sense for us to sell it at 70 per cent when we pay 100 per cent to upgrade them (the schools)."

The school board is now charging 100 per cent of the market price.

This will impact on the sale of the old Stone School in Acton.

**North Education Centre serves 26 schools**

The North Education Centre, one of three area offices serving the needs of the schools in Halton, is located in Milton Heights on Third Side Rd. near Kelso Conservation Area. It provides services for three families of schools—Acton, Georgetown, and Milton, which consist—of 22 elementary and four secondary schools; 7,693 elementary students and 4,071 secondary students.

James Morrison, North area chairman and superintendent of schools for Acton and Georgetown and David Kutz, superintendent of schools for Milton area schools, are responsible for the leadership, organization, and supervision of these schools.

Also working out of the centre is psychologist, Dan Dalton who, along with the psycho-educational associates, provides psychological testing and assessment for students who may be experiencing difficulties in classroom situations.

A number of consultants based at the North Education Centre provide resources and programming aids to teachers in the areas of language arts, physical and health education, visual arts and primary, junior and special education.

Further staff support assist in the areas of social work, speech correction, hard of hearing, and remediation. In addition, clerical staff and the plant operations department are located in this office.

The combined efforts of the North Education staff assist the schools by providing meaningful programs for the students as well as a service to the parents and communities of North Halton.
