During the fall maintenance check of municipal heating systems it was discovered there are cracks in the heat exchangers of the two furnaces at the rink, which are gas fired. The report from recreation director Tom Shepard stated the cracks would become bigger if the furnaces were turned on "causing them to emit fumes at a potentially dangerous level.
