### Candidates stress experience

Both of the candidates running for Acton's seat on Halton Hills Hydro Commission are stressing their experience in this campaign. Will McEachern 19 years as a commissioner and Doug Mason 39 years as a hydro worker.

At last Wednesday's all-candidates meeting McEachern noted how he has seen the hydro operation, revenue and budget grow considerably during his 17 years with Acton Hydro and two years on Halton Hills Hydro. He served 10 years as chairman of the old Acton commission and for the past two years as vice-chairman of the Halton Hills body.

A hydro commissioner must be "mindful" of today's economic situation and restraints, McEachern noted, adding he has been a "strong voice" for keeping the local office open for bill paying and now all works for the hydro is operated out of Acton.


