**\$1,000 fine, day in jail for convicted skin thief**

John Jordan, 24 Ransom St., Acton, was sentenced to one day in jail and handed a \$1,000 fine for his part in the theft of leather skins from Beardmore tannery last year.

Jordan pleaded guilty earlier this month, to charges of theft over \$200. He admitted in court he had driven skid loads of skins to a Toronto shoe repair shop last year between October and November where he received money. He himself was paid over \$500 for his two trips.

Provincial court Judge William Sharpe Thursday ignored Jordan's lawyers appeal for a conditional discharge. Gerald Punnett argued that Jordan had not stolen from his employer, which is breach of trust and means an automatic jail sentence. But, Punnett stressed, Jordan had lost his job at Tyler Transport, and if given a jail sentence, his licence as a groom at a race-track, where he is now employed, will come under review.

Punnett recommended a conditional discharge for his client, and maybe community service work and some form of restitution for the stolen skins.

Assistant Crown Attorney John Ayre reminded Judge Sharpe that criminal activities had taken place, and with all illegal matters goes a certain "stigma". The crown opposed the discharge, Jordan did gain financially from the thefts.

Judge Sharpe pointed out that even though he was impressed with Jordan's pre-sentence report, he was not convinced a discharge was in order. Even though he did not steal from an employer, "it was pretty close to breach of trust," the Judge said.

Because it was his first offence, Judge Sharpe ruled Jordan should go to jail for a day and be fined \$1,000.

Local hunters are expected to take at least 88 deer during the third annual controlled hunt in Halton Region, operating from Monday November 1 to Thursday November 4.

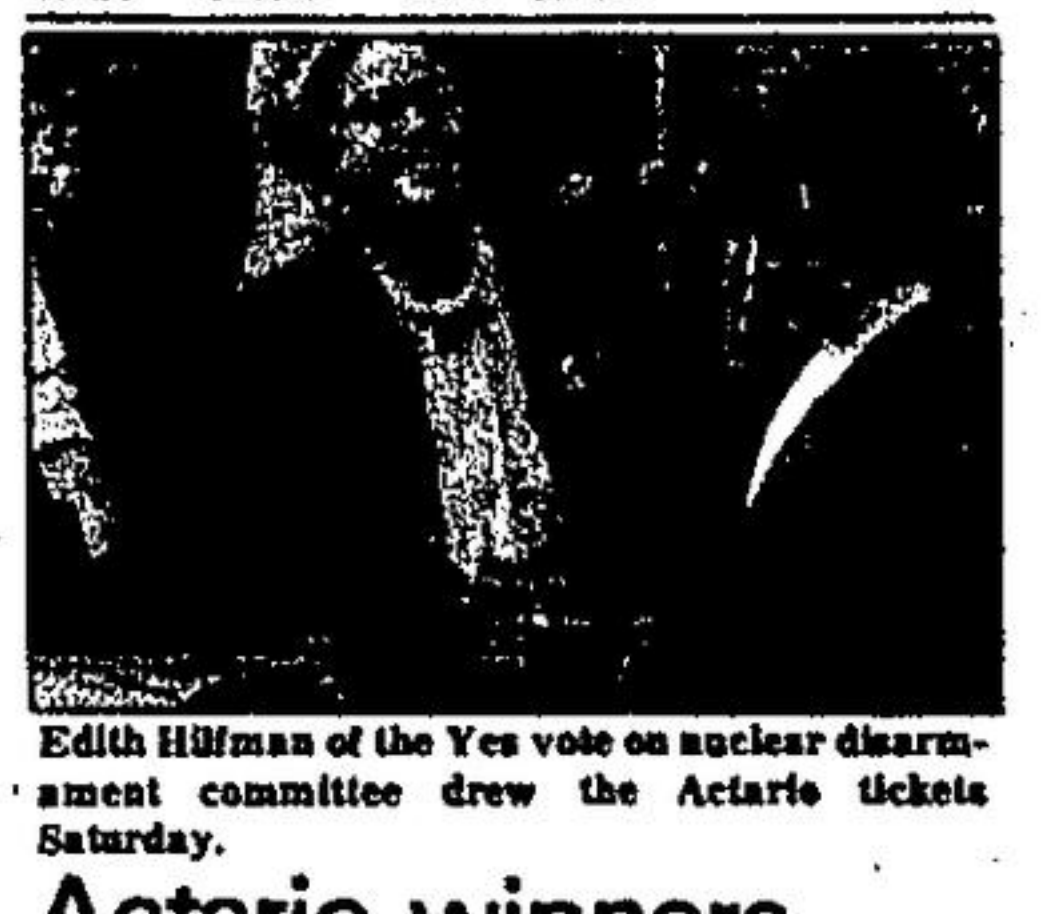
That figure represents the number of deer harvested in this area last year. Ministry of Natural Resources area biologist Nancy Tilt predicts an increase in that number this year as hunters have gained experience from the previous hunts.

The area biologist said about 600 hunters from Halton Region applied and of that number 475 were drawn from a lottery. The total represents 300 hunters north of Highway 401 and 175 south of Highway 401. Residents owning more than 50 acres will also be allowed to participate.

Halton Region hunters will contribute to the expected total harvest of 200 to 250 for Cambridge District.

Private property is only open as a hunting range with the owner's permission.

Milton Wards 1 and 3 Regional Coun. Bill Johnson is again this year making no hunting signs available to landowners who wish to ward off hunters.
