

# Part-time secretary for fire department

A part-time secretary retiral needs from the Georgetown fire hall to Halton Hills' fire department.

In a report to general committee last week, fire chief Bill Cunningham pointed out at present his department shares a secretary with the Treasury office. The deputy chief and fire prevention officer must transfer their sec-

retal needs from the same location (Maple Ave. Georgetown) offices. Records are kept at both offices.

"This does create a certain loss of time in convenience, duplication" and is a very inefficient system, his report stated.

department heads switching budgets without advising us," But he said, he had no difficulty with the hiring of a secretary for the balance of the year.

Councillor Russ Miller said he could not support the proposed 20 hours a week for the secretary. He suggested the person be hired for 10 hours.

Cunningham pointed out the additional costs would be covered by the revenue from the rental of the alarm panel, which was \$800 more than expected.

Councillor Mike Armstrong said he did not agree with 10 hours a week. By the time the secretary gets settled into work, then takes a coffee break, the hours are used up.

Mayor Pete Pomeroy said he would only support the hiring of a secretary until the end of the budget year. Perhaps, he said, a person in another department can be freed up to work at the fire hall.

Committee approved the hiring.

# Farm museum attracts 35,000

When the Ontario Agriculture Museum near Milton closes down for the season, more than 35,000 visitors will have passed through its gates—an increase of about 75 percent over last year.

Much of this increased attendance is due to the number of families who vacationed closer to home this summer,

says Cindy Lindsay, Museum Public Relations Officer.

A visitor's survey indicated many families took day trips this summer and were attracted to the museum because it offered them the opportunity to learn more about farm life in Ontario in a setting that is fun for the whole family.

The museum has also extended its operation for the schools. The museum's regular season was completed at Thanksgiving but the museum will continue to offer tours to school children until mid-November. It will also be open for school tours in early spring. The regular season for the public begins in May.

During the past season an antique rally, a family corn festival and a harvest fair complete with a country supper were featured. Lindsay says these events were so successful, the museum plans to hold them again next year.

There are now plans for several new displays at the museum, which is operated by the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food. These include a slaughterhouse, a smoke house and a saw mill.

The museum is also working on the reconstruction of a fanning mill factory. This display will trace the development of fanning mills, wooden devices at one time used by farmers to clean grain.

The museum now boasts 25 display buildings on 32 hectares (80 acres) of farmland, and further buildings and displays are planned. Lindsay says they are hoping to complete construction of about 60 buildings by 1990.

The museum, opened in 1979, also features a large collection of antique tractors and has several one-of-a-kind tractors including a very rare Stinson Beaver tractor.

The Ontario Agricultural Museum is located five kilometres west of Milton, just south of Highway 401.

#### NAMES NOT ON POLLING LIST

Any person who has qualified to have his name entered on the polling list during the period of enumeration (September 7th, 1982 to September 30th, 1982) and finds that his name is not entered thereon or who has not filed the necessary forms to have his name entered during the period of corrections and additions to the list (ending October 20th, 1982) can attend the Returning Officer's Office to secure a certificate which will allow his name to be entered at the polling station. In addition to this, qualified electors may be entitled to have their name added to the list at the polling station on polling day.

Qualified Elector means a person who during the period of September 7th, 1982 to October 20th, 1982 was a Canadian Citizen or other British Subject, a resident of Milton or a non-resident owner or tenant or a spouse thereof and has attained the age of 18 years by November 8th, 1982.

Any person whose name is entered on the polling list for a polling subdivision or who has obtained a certificate entitling him to vote and who is:

- a person other than one who is in a hospital or other institution, where a polling place has been provided on such premises for the purpose of polling or where provision has been made to attend upon such persons for the purpose of receiving their ballot (Halton Centennial Manor); and
- a person who is certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner, by certificate filed with the Clerk Co-ordinator, to be physically incapable of attending a polling place;
- a person absent from his regular residence by reason of attending an educational institution and who is entered in the list for the polling subdivision in which he normally resides and who expects by reason of such absence to be unable to vote at the advance polls or on polling day; or
- a person who expects to be absent from his polling subdivision during the election period including the advance polls and polling day by reason of his being engaged for hire or reward in the business of transportation by railway, air, water or motor vehicle,

may vote by proxy in that polling subdivision.

Any person who is entitled to vote by proxy, above noted, may appoint in writing in the prescribed form, available at the Office of the Returning Officer, 251 Main Street East, Milton, as his voting proxy any other person who is eligible as an elector in the municipality.

Such persons must be appointed and certified by the Clerk Co-ordinator of Milton during the period following Nomination Day (October 19th, 1982 to 5:00 p.m. on Polling Day, November 8th, 1982).
