Guinea
steers**

Three hundred and thirty nine 4-H club members across Ontario including 12 from Halton, have been nominated to compete in the 36th annual Queen's Guinea competition at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair on Friday, November 19.

Club members have finished a year of hard work in developing a steer for the competition. To be eligible an exhibitor must be a qualified member of a 4-H Club in 1982, have participated in a local achievement day, have completed all phases of the 4-H project, is at least 14 years of age January 1, 1982, and not have won the Queen's Guinea previously.

The exhibitor's steer must not weigh more than 750 pounds at a weigh-in May 1-15, have made a daily gain of at least 2.3 pounds during the five month period May 1 to October 15, and weigh at least 850 pounds on October 15, 1982.

Nominees in Halton are now busy putting their knowledge and skills to work on finishing touches to their entries.

Among the nominees from Halton are Gerry Clarke, RR 1, Georgetown, Paul Wilkinson, RR 3, Georgetown; Brian Wingfield, RR 3, Georgetown and David Lasby, RR 2 Rockwood.

All nominees may not qualify for participation at the Royal, the premier agricultural show in Canada.

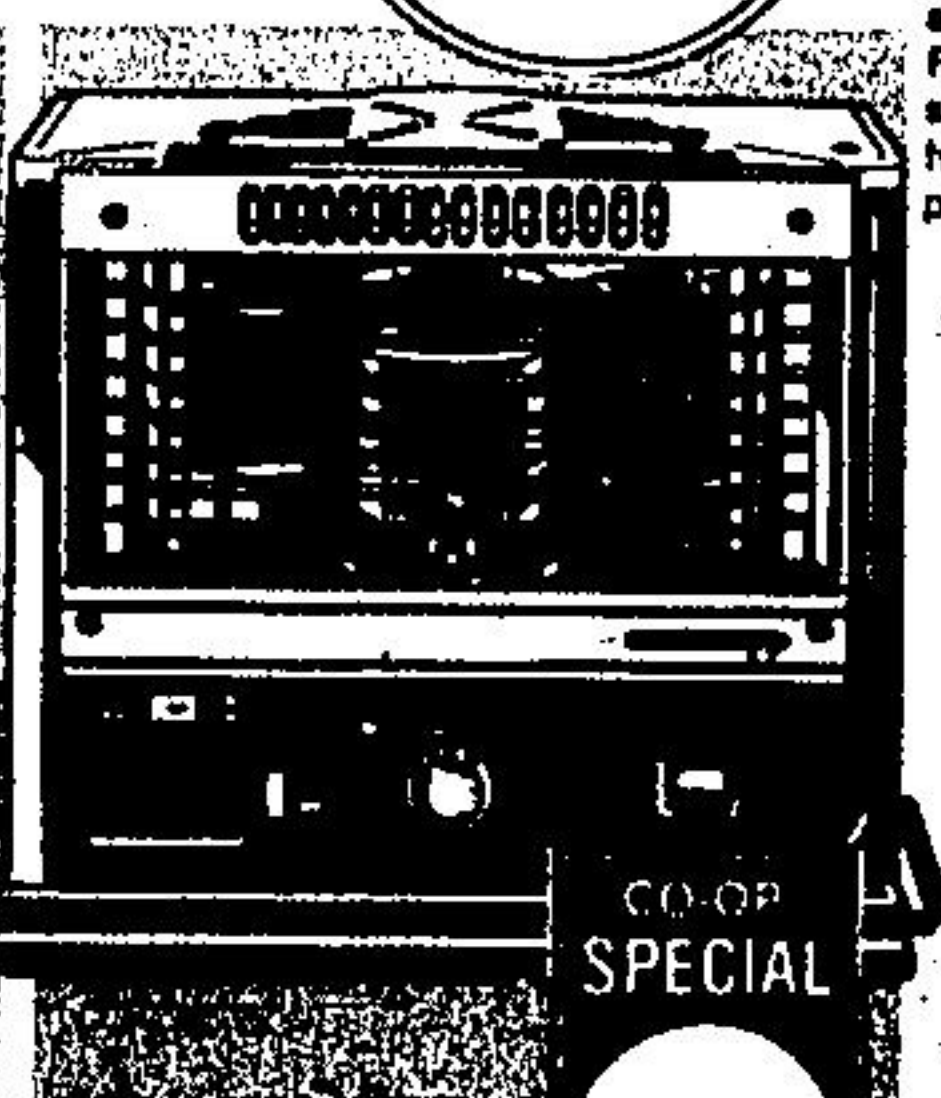
