Lecture series in Erin

Four University of Waterloo professors will be taking part in a lecture series in Erin this fall, presented by Extended Learning Opportunities, a senior citizen group in the community.

The lectures will be given Thursday mornings at 10 a.m., Nov. 11 to Dec. 2, in the Legion hall.

The Nov. 11 lecture will be given by Dr. Frank Epp, historian, Conrad Grebel college, on the UW campus. A well-known speaker and writer, Dr. Epp will discuss "The Middle East in Conflict." He will bring years of first-hand experience and research to the subject. "The Policy of a United Canada" will be the subject of Dr. Stand McMullin, St. Paul's college, Nov. 18. Dr. McMullin is a professor of English; he has studied Canadian regionalism in depth and is the head of UW's Canadian studies program.

Dr. Michael McDonald, department of philosophy, will be the Nov. 25 speaker. He will deal with the question: How to tell right from wrong and will look at ways of evaluating every day moral questions without becoming either cynical or evasive.

Final speaker will be Dr. Peter Woolstencroft, political scientist. He will deal with the politics of education under the title "Parents, Values and Schools." Dr. Woolstencroft participated in the series organized by ELO last spring.

Church is not exempt

A plea from a church representative to have his church exempt from a \$200 administrative fee was rejected by Halton Region last Wednesday on the basis it would set a precedent for other non-profit organizations.

"Churches aren't broke institutions," claimed Councillor Jim Grieve. "There is no reason to waive this. They're businesses like anything else."

The request for a waiver was turned down by Administration and Finance Committee 5-3. The recommendation to reject the waiver goes before council Wednesday (today) for approval.

The Lowville United Church is seeking a building permit from the City of Burlington for an extension on their building. The charge for a Development Agreement needed in this case is \$200, set by the region.

Chief Administrative Officer Dennis Perlin admitted the request by the church was "sympathetic." Milton Mayor Gord Krantz thought committee was being "petty" about the request for a waiver from a church. "We'll let \$200,000 go by and not think of it, but we won't waive \$200 for a church," he said.
