The State of Pennsylvania by all reports has more than its share of whitetail deer since 33,000 of these animals were killed by trains, cars, and trucks last year and others met their fate by other means.

Conservation measures and mild winters were responsible for the animal explosion. This Whitetail State is a popular hunting ground for Ontario hunters and one of them informed me that 15,000 buck deer were shot last year during the first day of the hunt. That adds up to a lot of bush-beef for the freezer.

Some charter boats had to go out 15 miles to get a good catch. The weather, of course, made this trip impossible most of the time.

Many good salmon are being caught as of now in the lower Credit River but the Salmon Hunt is over and the prize money is gone with it.

Pat Chamberlain took a nice Coho while using a little Cleo (blue and silver) it weighed close to 19 pounds. It was taken in Lake Ontario. Pat has taken others in Georgian Bay waters.

Another increase

32 cent stamps Feb 15

Canada Post Corporation announced that increases in the basic Canadian letter rate will be increased two cents, starting February 15, 1983.

Under the rate proposals, reviewed and accepted as within restraint guidelines, the domestic letter rate would be 32 cents. All other rates and service fees would increase by six percent on January 15, 1983. In applying the

six per cent rule, the Corporation has followed the principal rounding off increases to the nearest cent.

Among the changes effective January 15 are:

-For large-volume mailers the range of incentive rates, based on the degree of mail preparation done by the customer, will be expanded from 20 cents to 28.5 cents.
