**Agencies coordinate in five year health plan**

A recent seminar on Health Promotion in Halton, sponsored by the Halton District Health Council, its Health Promotion Committee and the Halton Regional Health Unit, brought together representatives of Halton agencies and organizations involved in health promotion, several local regional councilors, Region of Halton Public Health Nurses and area District Health Council members and staff.

The seminar was to assist community groups in the evolution of a health promotion network and to receive input to help the committee develop a five year model for health promotion planning for Halton.

Dr. Jerry Conway, manager of health promotion services at the Ministry of Health, presented the Ministry's policy and the role of District Health Councils in health promotion. Dr. Rhonda Love from the University of Toronto's behavioural sciences department spoke on the many definitions of health promotion and specifically on its definition in relation to Halton.

Dr. Peter Cole, medical officer of health for Halton, discussed the Health Unit's

Health Promotion Survey being undertaken by them this year. Robbie Simpson, chairman of the council's health promotion committee discussed some ideas relating to the development of a health promotion plan.

Afternoon workshop sessions brought to light the need for agencies to combine efforts by discussing areas of mutual concern and the development of a newsletter to which organizations might submit programs of interest. The committee received a number of positive ideas and suggestions on how to proceed in the development of a five year plan for health promotion in Halton. The committee will now assess this input, develop some of the suggestions more fully and get back to the agencies and community on a local basis for more detailed discussions.

It was generally agreed that while health promotion is a complex subject, there is enough work for everybody in the field and that the Health Council and the Regional Health Unit might be the best agencies to co-ordinate efforts in the region.

**Sod turning new citadel this Saturday**

The Halton Hills Salvation Army will hold a ground breaking ceremony on the site of its new Citadel on Mill St. East in Acton at 3 p.m.

The long-awaited church building for the Corps will cost about \$500,000 and has been months in the planning.

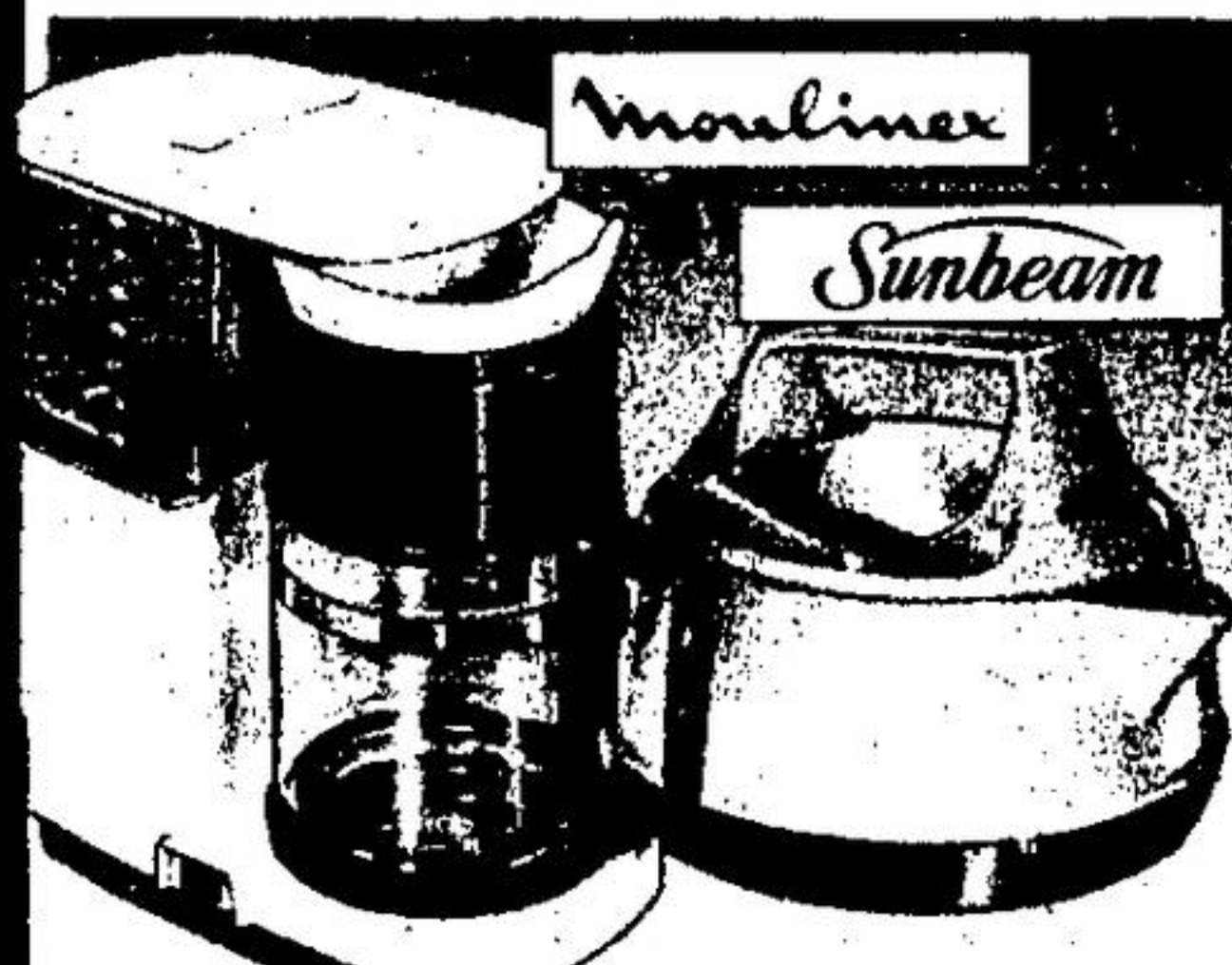
