Armed robbery

On Thursday October 22 at 1.25 p.m., a young man wearing a white scarf over the lower part of his face and carrying a sawed-off rifle robbed the owner of Carlinbeth Fuels in Campbellville.

Owner Bert Walton, 58, surprised the thief in the office, but was robbed of an undetermined amount of money. No shots were fired, and no injuries occurred.

The suspect is described as being in his early 20s, 5'7"-5'8", between 140 and 160 lbs, hazel eyes, brunette hair and wearing blue jeans and a blue grey bulky sweater.

The thief forced the rear door open between 1.25 and 2 p.m., according to police reports.

He took the keys to Walton's 1969 International half-ton cream colored truck with a white top. Police have been unable to locate the stolen truck as yet. He drove south on the Guelph Line.

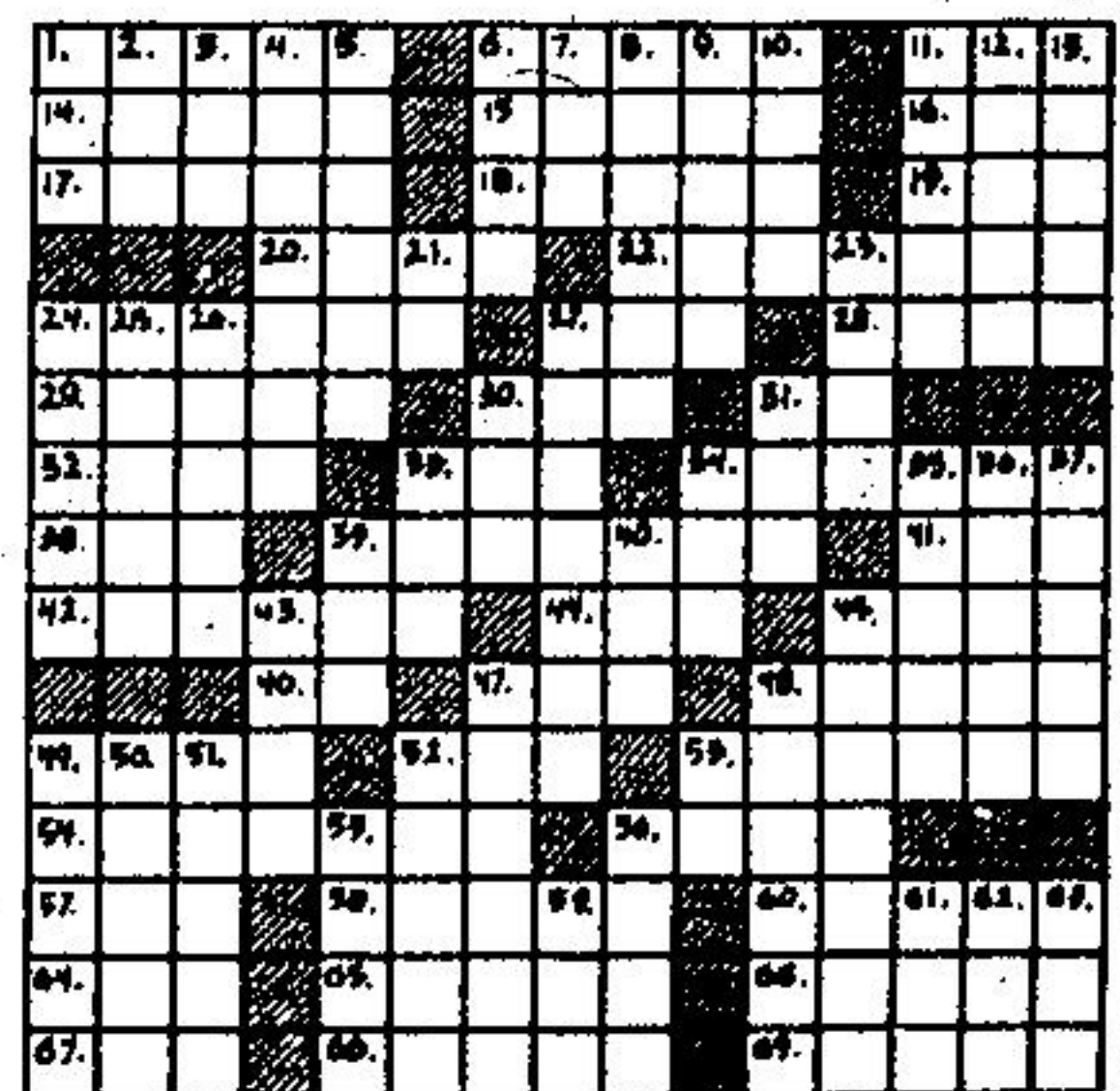
