

Ground broken for new citadel

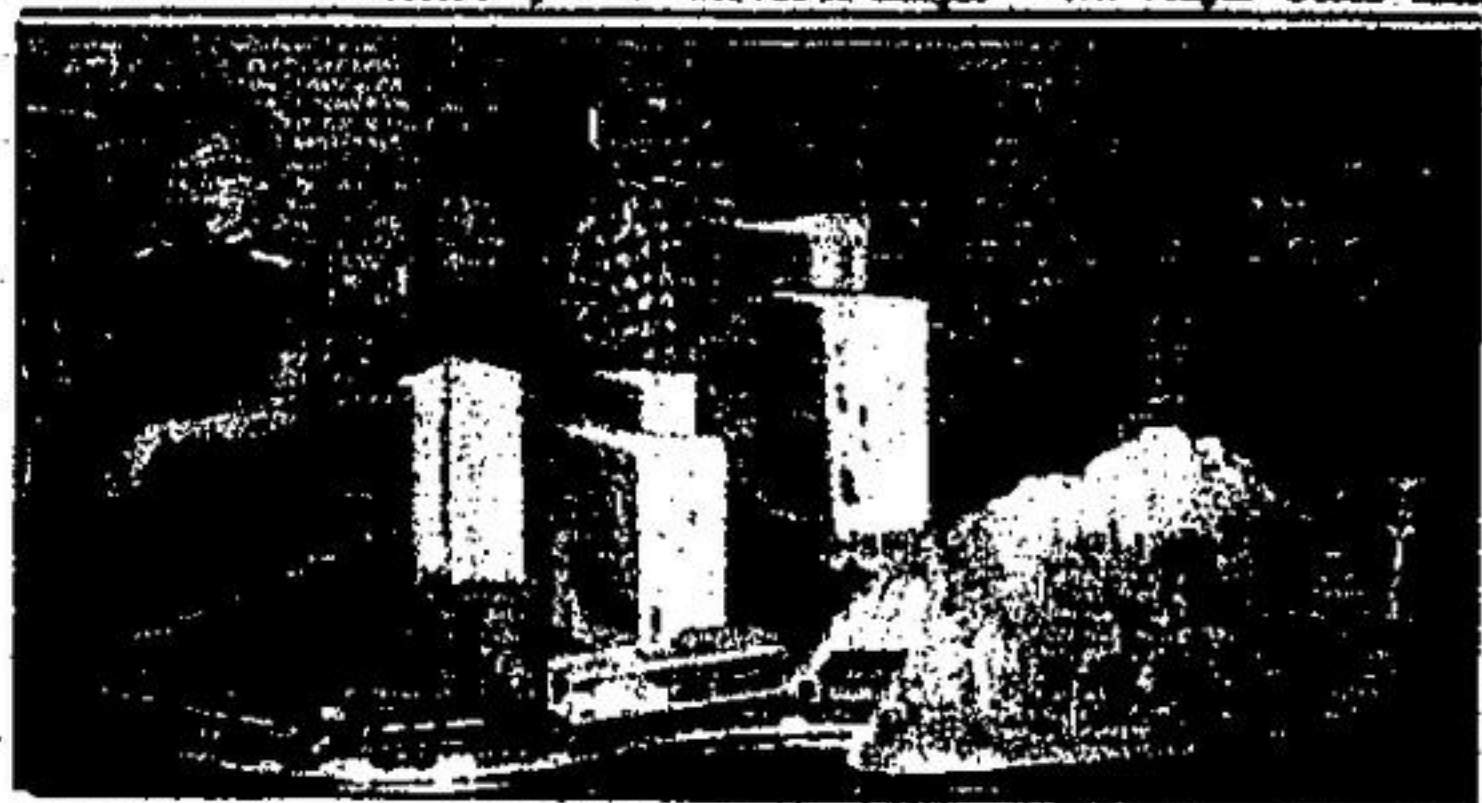
The ground was broken, at a short service, for the new Salvation Army Citadel on Mill St. East in Acton.

The highlight of the program was the presentation of a gold-painted shovel to Major Norman Coles, Divisional Commander for southern Ontario, by the architect, William Jarrett. Major Coles then

broke the ground for the approximately \$300,000 church which will cover adjacent lots on Mill St. East, not far from Canadian Tire and Church St. East.

About 50 people attended the service with Major Coles presiding. Local head of the Salvation Army, Envy Douglas Vale, assisted in conducting the service and Rev. John Cooper, head of the Acton Clergy Association, was on hand to give a scripture reading. Mayor Peter Pomeroy brought greetings from Halton Hills.

The sod turfs of the Salvation Army's third year in Halton Hills.



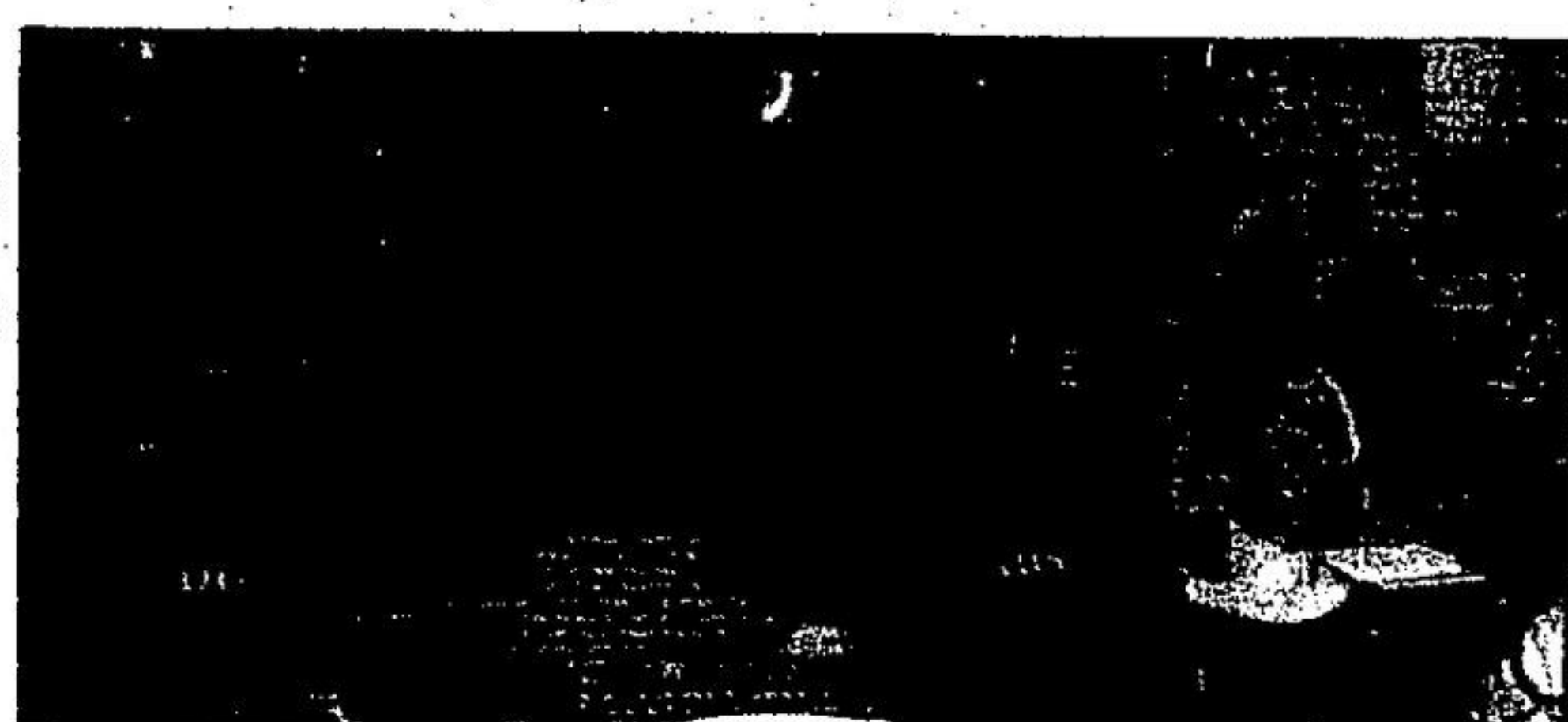
