To maintain its share, Canada needs to control costs - of materials, energy, manpower, transport - while keeping up or improving quality. These are the economic facts of life in the pulp and paper industry.

Today we will talk about words. You speak them everyday. Words will make you or break you, they will heal you or make you sick. According to the Bible, Words destroy us or make us full of life, happiness and health.

Jesus himself said, "For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy Words thou shalt be condemned" (Matt. 12:37).

Have you ever realized the importance of your words... in Mark 11:23 this states "For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith." If you constantly speak negative, you are speaking what is on the innermost of you, and you will have what you are speaking. If, on the

Infants born on or after Nov. 1, 1982, must be secured in an appropriate rear-facing carrier when travelling in a motor vehicle.

These infants, as they grow into the toddler stage of between 9 and 18 kilograms (20 and 40 pounds), must be properly secured in an appropriate child seat.

All pre-schoolers, between 18 and 23 kilograms (40 and 50 pounds), must be secured in a lap belt.

Children over 23 kilograms (50 pounds) must use the full seat belt assembly.

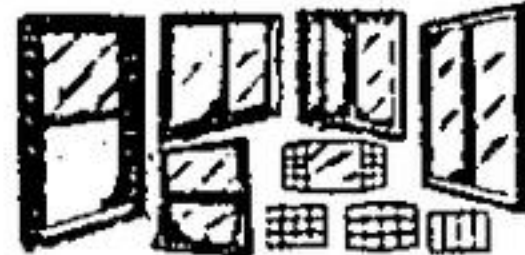
