

approached personally, following initial introductory correspondence, and asked to contribute to the campaign's financial goal. In an interview a year ago, Mrs. Fineran suggested a permanent facility could help improve the role of the home. A garden could be esta-

blished and tended to by residents and work shops would be a possibility. Halton Recovery House has no capital reserves

as it runs solely on operational funds supplied in part by Halton Region. The efforts to establish a capital reserve are

anticipated to begin shortly with the start of the fundraising campaign.
