Appoint fact finder for board-teacher talks

Dr. William Marcotte of Toronto has been appointed as a fact finder by the Education Relations Commission in the negotiations between the trustees and teachers of the Halton Roman Catholic Separate School Board. As a fact finder Dr. Marcotte will meet with the parties and write a report setting out which matters have been agreed upon and which matters remain in dispute. The report may also contain recommendations for settlement.

Dr. Marcotte, a graduate of Loyola University in 1970, received a M.Ed. from McGill in 1975 and a D.Ed. from the University of Toronto in 1980. His doctoral thesis was "An Examination of Collective Bargaining Between Canadian Public School Teachers and their Employers". As a teacher, 1971-76, teacher negotiator 1973-1976 and Vice-President of the Provincial Association of Catholic Teachers (Quebec), he brings a solid background in education to this appointment. In the past few years, he has become very knowledgeable of the education sector in Ontario. Dr. Marcotte has an independent practice as a mediator and arbitrator in labour relations. Previously, he was a Senior Consultant in Industrial Relations with Woods Gordon.

Out doors

Hunting in the rain is a tough, very unscientific, proposition when one's legs are soaked and the trees are loaded, every step adds to the misery.

Having to wear rain pants and coats while hunting makes for low success rates, the noise that type of clothing makes as one moves around can be detected by a Whitetail long before one is within any decent range. Most deer were alerted on the past four day hunt well before the hunter was in range.

Very few problems arose on this hunt, landowner-hunter relations were very good in North Halton. Some complaints of trespassing were lodged in the Milton area, some hunters were using railway rights of way. This problem should be worked out with the Ministry of Natural Resources for future hunts.

I have to give the MNR credit for a well regulated and policed hunt, keep up the good work Cambridge.

Fishing was tops for the first three days of November in Georgian Bay areas and rivers were on the rise. Catches were reported in the Meaford and Thornbury areas with quite a few Lunker fish taken.

Reports from Salmon anglers fishing in the Credit River are that a large run of Rainbow trout are as far up the river as Norval. This river is now producing some very large Rainbows in late fall runs, hopefully the MNR will see fit to open a section in the future to a fall season.

Many anglers have in the past season taken a Lunker fish which has been frozen and now thoughts turn to how and where to have such a trophy mounted in the proper setting to fit one's rec room or mantel.

Raise funds for Halton Recovery House

A massive fundraising campaign is being launched to finance the purchase of a permanent facility for Halton Recovery House.

Helen Fineran, executive director of the home for the rehabilitation of alcoholics, said that although there is no immediate concern that the current facility may be sold, "reality dictates one day they will find a buyer."

She admits the large rented house in rural Milton provides a "therapeutic setting" but it is "not convenient to transport residents to and from employment."

The aim of the fundraising campaign is to raise \$50,000 for a down payment on a house, large enough to facilitate 12 residents. The existing home, in operation for six years, has a capacity of nine residents.

A lengthy waiting list indicates to Mrs. Fineran the need for increased accommodations for Halton Recovery House. She contends that 12 residents should be the maximum for concern that the home could become more like an institution.

The home could be located anywhere in Halton but ideally, she would like to see it remain in Milton as the facility is established here and is identified with this community.

The underlying concern that the home will be sold, has prompted Halton Recovery House executive to form a committee to devise a format for fundraising.

A part-time employee has already been hired to compile a list of contacts in the area of service clubs. These community organizations will be approached personally, following initial introductory correspondence, and asked to contribute to the campaign's financial goal.

In an interview a year ago, Mrs. Fineran suggested a permanent facility could help improve the role of the home. A garden could be established and tended to by residents and work shops would be a possibility.

Halton Recovery House has no capital reserves as it runs solely on operational funds supplied in part by Halton Region.

The efforts to establish a capital reserve are anticipated to begin shortly with the start of the fundraising campaign.
