

Police beat

Police chase covers 7.5 km.

A police chase that started east of the Sixth Line on Highway 7 ended in Acton at Churchill Rd. at 2 a.m. Sunday.

The vehicle had no license plates, and traveled at speeds of up to 140 km. per hour. The driver of the blue 1967 Pontiac disobeyed police lights and road signs.

The vehicle stopped on Churchill Rd. and five people got out of the car and disappeared into the bushes. The chase covered 7.5 km. in three minutes.

A 17-year-old Georgetown youth was charged Monday at 2:30 p.m. in connection with the chase. The youth was charged with public mischief and dangerous driving.

A Nassagaweya home was broken into on November 8. Entry was gained through a window and between \$4,000 and \$5,000 in stereo equipment was stolen.

Police were called to a domestic dispute on Mill St. at 5:35 p.m. on Wednesday. No injuries were reported or charges were laid.

A 21-year-old Acton man has been charged with common assault after a fight at a Queen St. location Thursday.

The Acton Bowling Alley was broken into overnight last Tuesday and 10 cartons of cigarettes and \$60 in change were stolen. There was \$25 in damages to the window.

Friday night at 9:02 p.m. a 16-year-old Acton youth was charged with break and enter at Superior Motors on Main St. Entry was gained through a window and he was arrested inside the premises.

An 18-year-old Acton

man has been charged with two counts of assault causing bodily harm. At 10:10 p.m. at 14-year-old youth was assaulted at the Laundromat and at 10 p.m. a 15-year-old girl was assaulted. Both incidents took place on Saturday.

Four liquor charges were laid over the weekend, all on Saturday. At 1 a.m. two people were charged in one vehicle, one for having an open bottle while driving and the other for drinking under age. At 4:20 a.m. a man was charged on Cobblehill Rd. for driving with liquor readily available and at 9:30 p.m. at the Legion parking lot a man was charged for having liquor displayed in public view.

The Laundromat at 16 Mill St. reported a video machine was broken into and \$25 was stolen on Sunday.

A 1974 Chrysler parked on Mill St. received \$40 damage when someone smashed the front left side of the windshield overnight Saturday to Sunday.

Police answered domestic dispute calls at a home on Highway 25 at 6:10 p.m. and 7 p.m. Monday. One male received minor injuries and was treated and released from Georgetown District Hospital. There were no charges.

Vandals smashed the glass in the front lobby entrance door of the apartment building at 200 Churchill Rd. South Thursday afternoon. A rock was thrown through the window causing \$180 damage.
