Deer hunt totals down

Only half the number of deer expected to be taken in this area's third annual controlled deer hunt were harves-

In Halton, the 475 hunters bagged 45 deer compared to 88 taken in last year's four-day hunt. In all, 1,300 permits were issued in Cambridge District and 126 deer were shot, including hunter's contribution.

Ministry of Natural Resources area biologist Nancy Tilt has a feeling that hunter participation was down this year. Her suspisions will not be confirmed until registered hunters hand in their reports, a mandatory procedure if a hunter expects to participate in future hunts.

Pellet group surveys performed over the past two years indicate this area has a deer population of 12 to 15 per square mile, according to the biologist.

She blames the poor weather for the lower than anticipated harvest. A total harvest of 200 to 250 deer was expected in Cambridge District. The less then success-

ful hunt could mean a slight rise in road kills and more crop damage but, on the other hand, explains Mrs. Tilt, incidents poaching could be up.

A total of 600 hunters applied to participate in the controlled hunt in Halton and, of that number, 475 were drawn from a lottery. Correction




