Arabia. Eric Dietz, of Park St., left October 16 for six months in the middle east to first dismantie an asphalt plant in Tamra and relocate it in the nation's capital of Riyadh.

Dietz explains the plant is being moved because it has run out of work at its present location and has to move on. This is not Canada. asphalt plants move four or five times a year. Once the roads are built in one area, there is no use for the

plant. The Cox Construction employee was singled out for the job because of his experience with electrical and electronic equipment, and his ability to do the job. He has also worked with Cedarapids on Canadian jobs, and when that firm was asked to work in Saudi Arabia, they wanted

He has signed a three month contract with the Saudis, he says. And he has verbally told them he will stay on another three months to train men over there how to do his job. But he is free






