Man taken to hospital

A Georgetown man was taken to hospital Wednesday afternoon after his vehicle collided with a car driven by an Acton woman.

Halton Regional Police report Ian Riddle, 21, of Georgetown was northbound on Winston Churchill Blvd, just south of 10 Sideroad. Marie Zions, 42, of Acton, was driving southbound on Winston Churchill when the collision occurred.

Damage to Riddle's car has been estimated at \$2,000 while Zions' car sustained \$1,000 damage. He was taken to Georgetown Hospital with minor injuries.

Also anyone who has a specific questions about their own water and sewer bills is invited to attend. They

are asked to contact Whiting in advance of this evening drop-in so that he can advise regional staff to pull their individual billing information from the computers and have answers ready for the meeting. Whiting notes he has had two specific requests for water-sewer bill information already for that drop-in. Drop-in will then adjourn for the holidays and resume on a regular basis, three Friday afternoons monthly and one evening session each month, on January 7.

written, without any provision for aggregate protection areas, but the hearing officers or province could put aggregate protection in the plan. She said there were better reasons the region could have used to have the aggregate issue deferred than waiting for the NEC plan. She called for the part of the report referring to the NEC plan to be deleted.

Sheldon felt the region and province must be told that licensing of pits based on market demand might be acceptable, but freezing a lot of land based on geology reports wasn't acceptable.

Councillor Ross Knechtel urged when a region delegation meets with the province over the aggregate issue in the future, Queen's Park must be warned if land is frozen assessment will decrease from appeals and the province will have to pick up the tab through increased grants to the Town. The province has a financial stake in going against a land freeze, he said.

Maltby thought the region and province should be reminded that Halton Hills still supports no aggregate land freeze in the NEC plan, and if land is frozen the Town wants to be able to comment further. He said not all of the land which might be frozen for aggregate should be in the NEC, and not all the land should be outside the NEC.

Keith felt the part of this report dealing with the NEC plan should be retained and passed on to the region.

Councillor Roy Booth also said he was concerned about the province being told to forget about a land freeze outside the NEC because land could be frozen within the NEC. Land freeze policies should apply to all lands in Halton Hills.

Mayor Peter Pomeroy recalled Halton Hills had backed the region's move to defer the aggregate issue until the NEC plan is approved. He warned there is a big fight coming over the aggregate issue and urged council shouldn't go against the region's stand or be split on the issue.

Sheldon questioned that deferring the issue until the NEC plan is approved was the "safest way to go." She reminded council the NEC plan as it now sits deals with policies and criteria for opening a quarry and doesn't deal with the number of acres which could be mined. Queen's Park must get the message Halton Hills land should be looked at only from the policies and criteria standpoint, not number of acres.

Pomeroy disputed Sheldon's suggestion that regional councillors were forgetting that the NEC land is part of Halton Hills, and only she was misinterpreting the message from the region to the province. Sheldon countered she wasn't alone in her fears that the province will think it's all right to freeze NEC land for aggregate, adding she had received many calls. Pomeroy indicated he doubted others shared her view, if residents were concerned about the region's stand they'd have called regional councillors.

Councillor Dave Whiting said deferring the aggregate issue pending the NEC plan approval was done by region after receiving legal advice. Any other tactic would have meant the Ontario Municipal Board could come down hard on Halton Hills. He added the region tactic was formulated in a very short time, but it was based on considerable thought and good advice.
