ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the by-law may within twenty-one 121) days after the date of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the clerk of The Corpora tion of the Town of Halton Hills notice of his support of approval of the said by-law together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by law but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the by law will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection or notice of support and who have left with or delivered to the clerk undersigned, the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent and, similarly, to any person who has filed a request for a change in the provisions of the by law.

BY-LAW NO. 82-23

TOWN OF HALTON HILLS

BEING a By law to amend Restricted Area (Zoning) By-law No. 74-51, as amended by the Town of Hall

WHEREAS Council is empowered to enact this Bylaw by within bit the provisions of Section 39 and The Partners &cf. R.S.O. 1990, c. 379, as amended." AND WHEREAS the Subsidiary Planning Board has recommended to Council that Restricted Area (Zoning) By-law No. 74-51, as amended, be amended as hereinafter set out;

AND WHEREAS said recommendation conforms to the terms and intent of the Official Plan of the former Esquesing Planning Area: NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE COR

PORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS ENACTS THE FOLLOWING:

- Section 6.1 of Restricted Area (Zoning) By-law No. 74-51, as amended, of the Town of Halton Hills (Esquesing) is hereby amended by deleting sub-section (e) Recreational and the uses contained therein as permitted uses within the Rural (RU) Zone.
- Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1 of this By-law, any use, building or structure existing at the date of the passing of this Bylaw and permitted in accordance with the provisions of Section 6.1 (e) of said By-law No. 74-51, as amended, are deemed to conform to the provisions of Section 6.1 of said By-law 74-51. Notwithstanding the provision of Section 2 of

this By law, any enlargement or expansion of a use, building or structure permitted in accordance with said Section 2 of this By-law shall require approval as provided for in Section 49 of The Planning Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 379.

This By law shall become effective from and after the date of passing hereof, subject to the approval of the Ontano Municipal Board.

EXPLANATORY NOTE **PURPOSE OF THE BY-LAW**

The purpose of By law 82-23 is to amend the "Rural" designated permitted uses by removing recreational, picnic areas and parks. It is also the purpose of the By-law to recognize any use, building or structure existing at the date of enactment of Bylaw 82-23, which exists in accordance with the provisions of the existing By-law 74-51, as amended, Section 6.1, however, enlargements or expansion or a use, building or structure will require municipal approvats under Section 49 of The Planning Act, R S.O. 1960.

EFFECT OF THE BY-LAW

The effect of the By law is to recognize all existing legal recreational uses within the "Rural" designated lands in the municipality, and to provide for their orderly and controlled expension or enlargement. The By law would also prohibit any future recreational land uses in the "Rural" designated lands without prior approval of the municipality.

LOCATION OF THE LANDS AFFECTED

The lands affected by this By-law are all lands designated "Rural" in the existing Zoning By law 74-51, as amended.




