W.J. Finlay

William John Finlay, 128 Church St. died November 20 in Guelph General Hospital following an eight month illness. He was born in Castleberg, County Tyrone, Ireland, the son of Sarah and John Finlay. He came to Canada in 1924, and Acton 59 years ago. On

November 11, 1929, he married Ruth Finlay in Knox Presbyterian Church, Acton. The couple lived on Church St. for 34 years. He worked at Beardmore tannery before his retirement, and was a member of the Acton Legion and affiliated with the Anglican Church. Mr. Finlay served in

active service for five years, three of which were spent overseas. His greatest hobby was gardening and he was known around town as "Potato King". Rev. Lawrence Duby officiated at the November 23 funeral. The Royal Canadian Legion members attended. Interment was at

Fairview Cemetery. Pallbearers were grandsons Mike Timbers, Craig Timbers and Brent Timbers and friends Wayne Allan, Bert Fowler and Bill Cook.

Mr. Finlay is survived by his wife Ruth Finlay. He was predeceased by a daughter Mrs. Kathleen Timbers and a brother James Finlay.

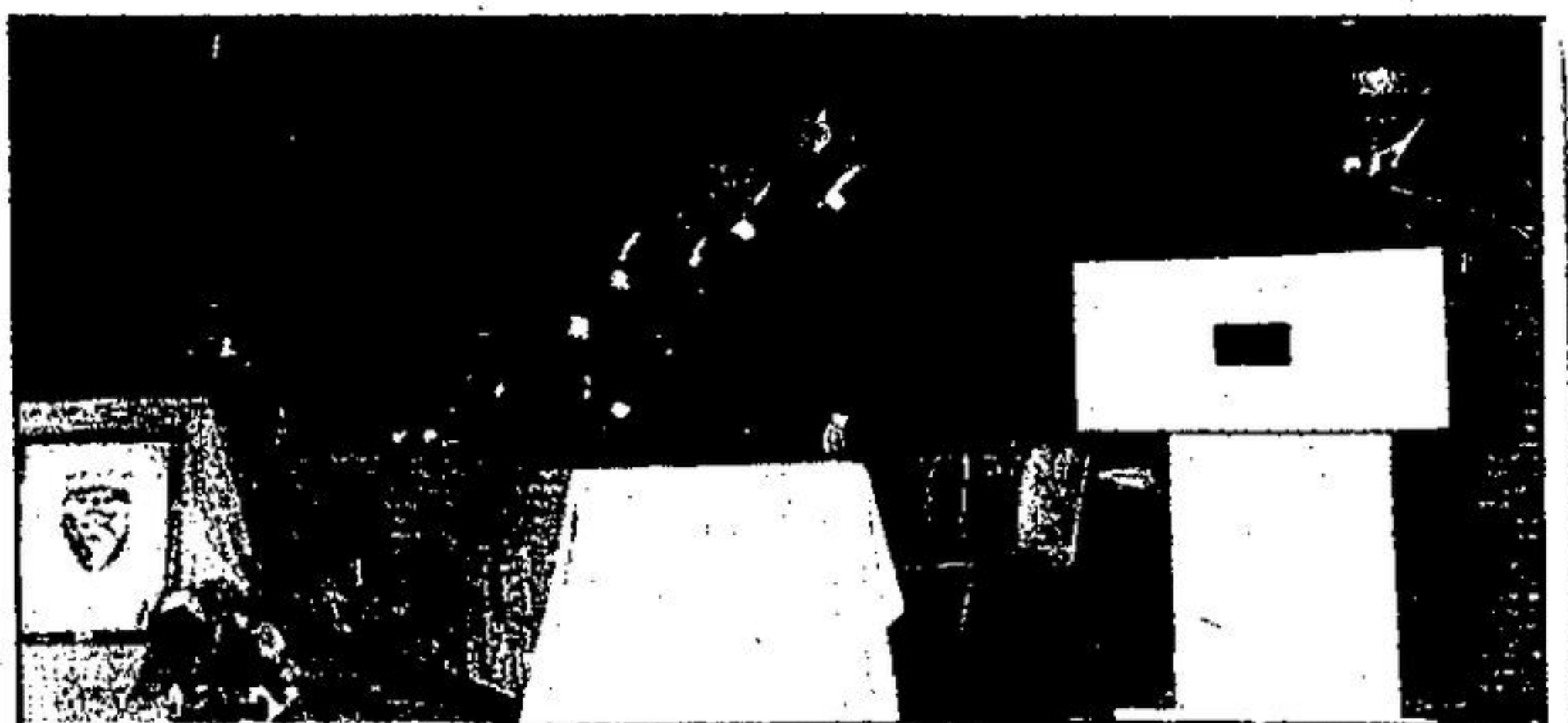
