Clergy Comment

One of the greatest Christmas hymns, in my opinion (and probably in the opinion of many others) is Silent Night, a favorite through the ages for its simple, sweet melody. But one of the chief reasons why it is my favorite is because of its words, and for the same reason I would rank O Little Town of Bethlehem a close second. Both of these hymns have something important in common: The focus is on stillness and quiet as God's highest gift, the Christ, is born a human on the earth. "All is calm, all is bright," and, "How silently, how silently, the wondrous gift is given" are lines that breathe into our hearts the soothing images of peace that Christmas, in part, represents. Yet, both these hymns were written not in quiet, calm periods of history but in periods of turmoil and clamour. Silent Night was penned in Germany in 1818 during a time of great political unrest as Europe tried to sort itself out after the Napoleonic wars: O Little Town of Bethlehem was written in the United States in 1863 as that nation tried to heal the vast wounds left by the Civil War. The entire century around these songs was one of upheaval and ferment as the Industrial Revolution overturned traditional ways and threw societies into chaos; the century had Metternich and Marx, Bismark and Darwin. Calm it wasn't. Yet, if anything, ours is a time of even greater upheaval. Ours has been the century of flight and of television; of cars and space shuttles; nuclear reactors and nuclear missiles; of penicillin and insulin and also of Quisquith and Beirut. And as for silence, it sometimes seems like a thing of the past. Ours is the age of video games and talking wrist watches; when the ringing of the cash register drowns out the ringing of church chimes; when a group of rollers in front of the Eaton Centre can't sing O Come All Ye Faithful above the roar of car engines, the squeal of tires and the jabber of thousands of voices herding like lemmings into the yawning abyss of the Shrine of Shriners; the temple of consumerism that the Eaton Centre is.

Bateman spearheads outdoor education
World-famous wildlife artist Bob Bateman, who taught in Halton for almost 20 years, is hoping that teachers from across Halton Region will take advantage of the outdoor education opportunities at Crawford Lake. Bateman and his wife, Birgit, are co-chairman of the Halton Region Conservation Foundation education committee, which is promoting knowledge about the unique nature of Crawford Lake, located near Guelph Line and Steeles Ave. in rural Milton. The unique layered sediment at the bottom of the lake permits accurate dating of material found in the sediment and led to the discovery of the most accurately dated prehistoric Indian Village in Canada. The Foundation has already raised more than \$100,000 to rebuild the 500 year old village on its original site near the lake. Fund raising for the Crawford Lake Indian Village and Conservation Centre will continue for another two years.
