# Board stand tough

"This is the year to 'bite the bullet' and make tough decisions," says Halton Board of Education vice chairman Betty. Fisher as she convinced fellow trustees to keep the 1983 budget to eight per

In a report to the Board, the Georgetown representative pointed out in the past four years, the board's expenditures have increased by about 70 per cent, while there has been an eight per cent decrease in enrolment. Trustees agreed with her that the administration staff of the board present to the finance committee a budget of not more than eight per cent increase. This would be a decrease from the 13.7 per cent dollar increase from last year, which resulted in a mill rate increase of 18.5 per cent.
