Nielsen's Clothing nipped Heller's 6-5 in Industrial action on Sunday night.

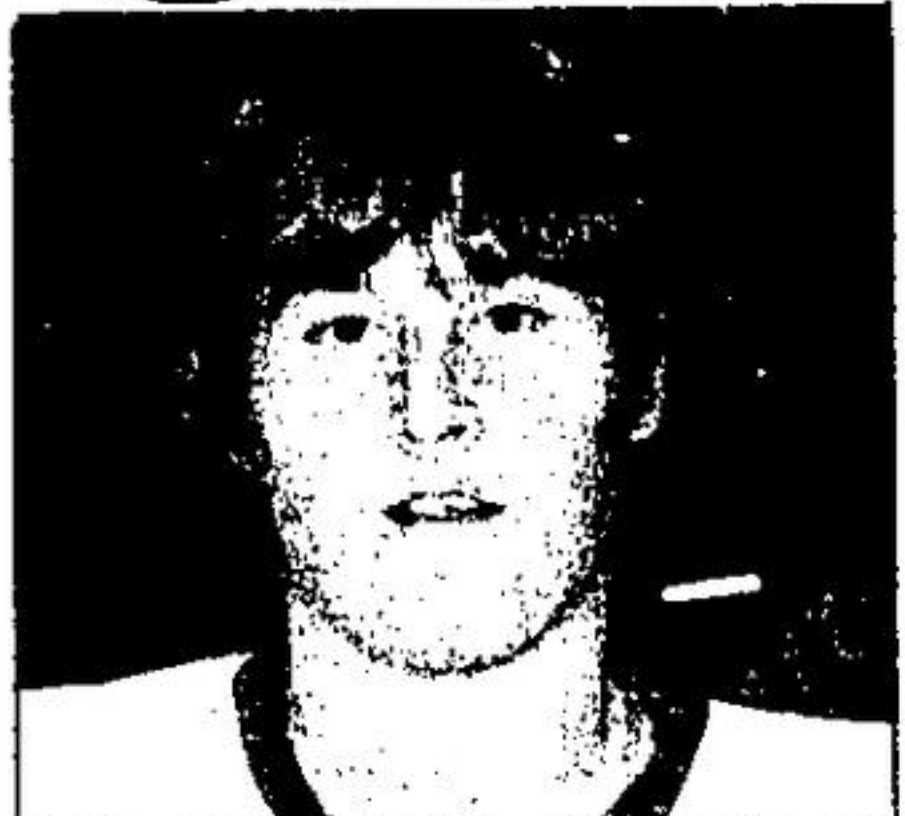
