Funks were in Guelph during robbers' visit

On Friday December 16, our small store was held up at gun point by two masked individuals. My husband and I were in Guelph putting the finishing touches to our Christmas shopping.

At 8:45 p.m. two men walked into the store, pointed a revolver at Glen Seim and demanded the money in the cash register. The thieves fled and Glen called upstairs to our daughter, Wendy, who put in a call to the OPP and then locked the

store. The police responded immediately, an officer arrived within five minutes, with others following.

At first, Glen was unable to give any description of the thieves to the police, as he was unable to remember anything about them except the gun. After he calmed down he was able to remember much more about them than he first thought he would recall.

My husband and I arrived home at 10:15 p.m. to find four police cars around the store.

After I made certain both Glen and Wendy were unharmed, (this was my first horrible fear) I felt immense relief and then almost uncontrollable rage that again someone had invaded my privacy, with a gun this time.

I cannot for the life of me understand why anyone would risk killing another human being, especially a teenager, for a minimal amount of money.

I have always been proud of our staff, they have proven themselves to be trustworthy, loyal,

courteous and accommodating to my requests. Now I'm doubly proud of them, especially Glen who acted with extreme care in a very tense situation, and Wendy who responded to Glen's call for help in exactly the manner she was taught, and also to Pat, Colleen, Carter and Ken who are now understandably nervous when at work, but are still willing.

To those in the village who expressed their concern may I say thank you. I would

especially like to thank Marion and Darryl Nichol and Jenny and John Milton who responded to Wendy's call for help and stayed on to help Jim and I calm ourselves and help us prepare the store for the next day.

Last but certainly not least, I would like to express our admiration to the Guelph OPP who were there fast and acted with calm reassurance.

Ontario Hydro has announced that the wholesale cost of power purchased by Halton Hills Hydro Commission from Ontario Hydro during 1983 will increase by 8.2 per cent effective January 1, 1983.

Due to the higher cost of wholesale power and higher cost of providing service, the Halton Hills Hydro Commission finds it necessary to increase the 1983 retail rates by 8.2 per cent effective January 1, 1983 as follows:
