Hank Porte, had a successful auction sale at his farm home on the Sixth Line on Saturday. He will be moving to Kitchener to make his home with his daughter.

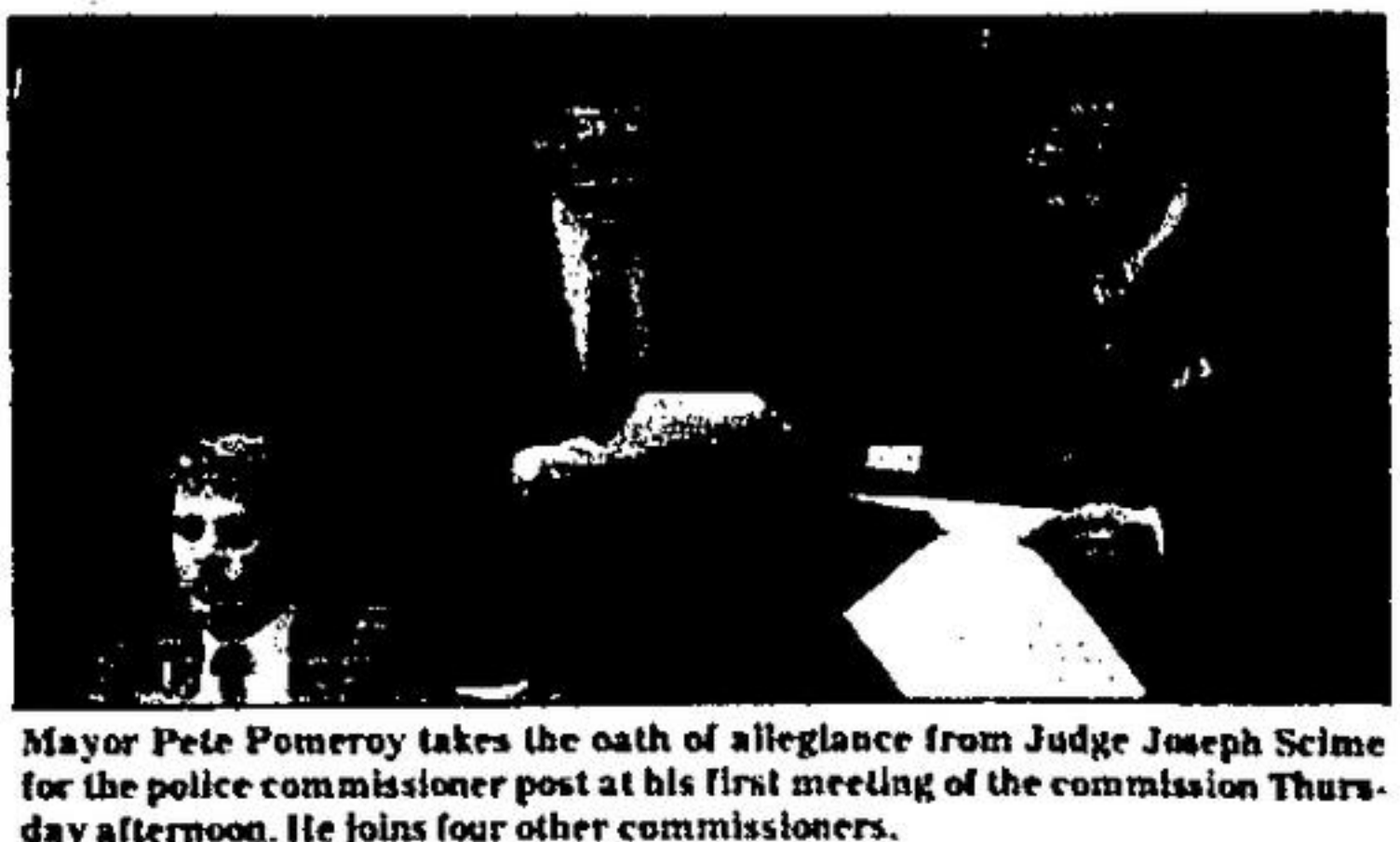
### \$500 grant

Under a new agreement the Town of Halton Hills will grant \$500 a year to the Township of Erin toward major expenditures of the Ballinafad Community Hall.

The original agreement, just terminated, saw Halton Hills and Erin Township share the costs of yearly maintenance deficits. The hall is located on the Erin Township side of the boundary line.

The \$500 grant will not necessarily mean Halton Hills is paying less since the amount of the deficits in the past has ranged from \$788 down to zero, last year and 1979.

A staff recommendation advocating the change pointed out neither the Township of Erin or the Town of Halton Hills has direct control over the operating cost, so suggested the agreement.



### Audio visual project deferred to 1983

At Mayor Pete Pomeroy's first meeting with the police commissioners, they voted to put the audio visual project ahead into the 1983 budget and not use up surplus funds from 1982.

At the last commission meeting, Burlington commissioner Jim Grieve was outvoted 3 to 1 in favor of using the funds in 1982 to pay for the project.

"I didn't support this decision (of using surplus funds)," he told a special meeting of regional council on Wednesday. "It's my belief that money should not be spent that way."

Mayor Harry Barrett also told council that "the audio visual project was not budgeted and will be an additional debenture."

Council asked Grieve to tell the commissioners region's decision not to use the surplus funds and wait until the 1983 budget.

But Commissioner Ric Morrow stated that the commissioners decided to defer the issue to the 1983 budget and that "direction gives us no council."

"We'd all like to think that regional council has nothing to do with us," said Jim Grieve, "but if they do not approve the money then there's not much we can do."

Police Chief James Harding continued to strongly support the issue of audio visual training for Halton police officers saying that "we have no intention of skimping."
