central He outlined possible study result scenarios, including the possibility it would be economically wiser not to consolidate the municipal operations. He said he expects all results of the study to be made public, for or against a complex.

After all the bids are received a few firms which look promising will be asked to make presentations to the committee on how they'll do the studies and what they'll cost, Poulstrup noted.

Poulstrup said he expects the study data and recommendations will be made totally public.

being done in three phases. The first would be to determine total space requirements for the municipality. Next, the Trafalgar Rd. site will be evaluated to see if it can accommodate the size of building the consultants say will be needed for the future. Once those two steps are completed the committee and council will be able to decide if the Trafalgar Rd. property is best or if another site will be needed, such as the Stevens' Estate in Georgetown on which the Town has put down a \$10,000 deposit.

The final phase of the study will be more detailed on space requirements for each department.

She noted since Halton Hills Hydro has expressed an interest in possibly locating a headquarters near a municipal complex in the future they had a representative at the meeting too, just to keep informed.

Pomeroy noted the space needs projections will cover the next five, 10, 15 and 20 year periods, the life of the new Official Plan.

Miller said he attended the meeting just to keep informed and

added he is much happier with the course now being followed by council in this matter. He said the way it was handled previously "upset me all along." He added it is hard to deal with something in-camera for a period of time and then handle making it public property.

He said he has a lot of reservations about the "magnitude" of the Stevens' Estate site and expects council will ask for a two month extension on its option which is due to expire January 20 so the studies can be conducted and the results reviewed before a decision is made. He added he believes the Trafalgar Rd. site is the preference of most citizens and many of the councillors.

Serjeantson said she thinks the studies will be a good "house-keeping" measure and will help council prepare for the tremendous growth looming on the horizon. The studies should help the Town justify the lot levies or developers' capital contributions for the future.

Sheldon said she expects for the next little while the committee will be meeting frequently to get everything set up for the studies. Then there won't be much activity on the issue while the studies are carried out.
