Funeral services for Jack Lawson

On December 26, 1982 John David Lawson of RR 4 Acton passed away in his 71st year in Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital. He was born June 6, 1912 on Lot 19, Fourth Line, Exquising Township, and moved to Lot 18 in 1918 where he farmed until he retired in 1967. His parents were Angus Lawson and Nellie McDowell. On September 14, 1946, Jack married Kathleen Lyons and they have one daughter Carol who teaches school at the M.Z. Bennett School in Acton. He served as trustee of the old Limehouse School for a number of years and a board member of Limehouse Cemetery. He was also a lifetime member of the Liberal Association, federally and provincially, and to his death was on the executive of Halton Burlington Provincial Liberal Association. Funeral services were held on December 29 at 2 p.m. in Knox Presbyterian Church, Georgetown, conducted by Rev. Peter Barrow. Interment was in the family plot in the Limehouse Cemetery.
