Police chase covers 15 km.

Speeds reached as high as 120 kilometres per hour during a 15 km police chase last Tuesday, January 4.

Police have charged a 20-year-old Church Hill Rd. S. man with dangerous driving following the incident.

According to police, the man failed to stop after receiving a signal to do so from a police officer at Highway 7 and the Fourth Line. The suspect sped away on the back roads, and it was not until he reached Trafalgar Rd. one mile north of the Halton-Erin town line eight minutes later that he stopped the vehicle.

Police reported there were no damages.

Pitchfork used to threaten woman

A Church St. W. man was charged with weapons dangerous to the public peace after he threatened someone with a pitchfork.

Police say there were no injuries when a 68-year-old man threatened the female visitor to the apartment upstairs from his Church St. West home with a pitchfork last Tuesday about 1.30 p.m.

Maloney retained for Mercuri appeal

Top criminal lawyer Arthur Maloney has been retained by Cosimo Mercuri for an appeal of his 1982 conviction for second degree murder.

Mercuri was sentenced to life in prison last April after a jury found him guilty in connection with the death of Howard Gibbons in a fire which levelled the Dominion Hotel in 1979. He is eligible for parole in 10 years.

Peter Tetley, of Maloney's office, noted they are awaiting the transcripts of the six week trial, before a date for the appeal can be set. He estimates the transcripts should be completed by the end of the month.

Michael Moldaver, of Greenspan and Moldaver, defended Mercuri in the original trial.

Co-defendant Michael McCristall, currently out on bail, is also awaiting appeal. He was found guilty of manslaughter and sentenced to two-years-less-a-day at the Ontario Correctional Institute. He was released on bail pending the appeal several months ago.

McCristall will be represented by the Greenspan and Arnup law firm. John Smith, of Brampton, defended him last spring, but he has now been made a judge in Peel region.

The Salvation Army, a multi-facet ministry, according to Acton's newest leaders Captain Wilson Perrin and Mrs. Captain Winnie Perrin.

The couple are replacing Envoys and Mrs. Douglas Vale, who have been transferred to Hope Acres, near Glencairn, to work as addiction counsellors.
