Town, Milton in new riding?

Mayor Pete Pomeroy is optimistically predicting Halton Hills will combine with Milton and a part of the rural area of Burlington to form a new federal riding. The riding proposed by the commission would join Halton Hills, Caledon and the west part of Brampton.
 The submission made to the Electoral Boundaries Commission by Regional Chairman Jack Raftis, Oakville Mayor Harry Barrett, Burlington Mayor Roly Bird, Milton Mayor Gord Krantz and Halton Hills Mayor Pete Pomeroy urged the Region of Halton be split contained with three ridings, Burlington, Oakville and Halton Hills-Milton.
 Pomeroy told council Monday night, this arrangement meets the population electoral quota of approximately 82,000. Both Burlington and Oakville exceed that amount but Halton Hills-Milton fall just short.
