and after planned space needs studies are completed and the present Trafalgar Rd. site is examined, there may be no need for the Stevens' Estate site. Also after the studies the committee could recommend numerous afternate sites be investigated, not just the Stevens' Estate site, so more appraisals would be needed. He siad Carney's suggestion was "well taken." Carney was still concerned about the option

due to expire. Clerk-administrator Ken Richardson said

there has been discussion about extending the January 20 deadline two months to March 20. He said they have verbal agreement with the owner of the Maple Ave. property, but nothing in writing, to extend the expiry date for the option. He said perhaps the time for more appraisals will be when the space needs study is ... completed. There will be a special council meeting if written agreement isn't given for the option extension.

Carney said before closing the deal more appraisals are necessary, adding he examined the original appraisal and wasn't satisfied. He agreed with Poulstrup's suggestion to send the appraisal matter to the building committee.


