5,700 students at education centre

Silver Creek Conservation Education Centre on 27 Sideroad is proving a popular spot for school students and a profitable one for the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

In 1982 more than 5,700 students, up 1,000 over the previous year, attended the Education Centre. The centre is almost completely booked until the end of the school year.

Another 2,000 students have attended "Maple Syrup Days"

in Orangeville, with many having their first glimpse of maple-sugaring in the woods. There have been openings still available in the March-April maple syrup program for approximately 1400 students.

Three hundred and seventy-seven high school students in the higher grades took advantage of the water management tour throughout the watershed. The students pay for the bus but the CVCA provides the education officer at no charge.
