

Bake Shop fills the gap

Mary McVeigh is following in her father's footsteps, as she and Grace Graham open the Bake Shop while at the same time, occupying a vacant store on the main street, the former Toddlers to Teens store.

The women do all the baking for the store at the rear of the building, making bread, muffins, cookies, tarts, cakes and pies for hungry customers.

The shop opened last week and already is getting rave reviews around town. Mary said that she had never been in business before, and took advantage of the fact there was no other bake shop in town. Her father was also a baker, making her decision a natural one.

Mary, of Nelson Court and Grace of Elmore Drive, keep the store open Tuesday to Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Board surplus \$3.4 million

Halton Board of Education had a \$3.4 million surplus in 1982, not \$4 million as was reported last week.

Confusion during interviews with two trustees regarding the surplus and the separate \$6.5 million Halton Board of Education invested with Crown Trust produced the error.

While some of the surplus funds might form part of the Crown Trust deposit, they are in fact two separate matters.

Out of the \$3.4 million, the board sent \$2.8 million back to the municipality to offset this year's property tax levy. The remaining \$600,000 went into two reserve funds which will be used for future computer purchases.

Trustee Arlene Bruce reported the surplus came from supplementary taxes on new homes built during the year, something the board is unable to budget for in advance; increased revenue from some investments; reduced interest costs for borrowing; provincial grants were higher than expected; the board received an unexpected energy grant; and money was budgetted in 1982 but not spent for teacher raises between September and the end of December (this money wasn't spent because new contract settlements for September 1982 to June 1983 haven't been reached yet).
