



Allow addition at Nor Halton Park

Halton Hills general committee Monday night agreed to pass a bylaw which will amend zoning for Nor Halton Park to permit expansion of a recreation building at the campground.

Last year the Town passed a zoning bylaw which would make it necessary for anyone wanting to establish a new recreation centre or expand facilities at an existing recreation centre in the rural area, to come to council or Halton Hills committee of Adjustment for permission.

Mery Barber, owner of Nor Halton Park objected to the by-Barber wants to expand the

rezoned on a "site apecific basis."

Councillor Pam Sheldon was concerned that allowing the campground building expansion and zoning amendment might not preserve the intregity of the bylaw giving Halton Hills control over future recreation uses in the rural area. She proposed the bylaw in the first place, at the time pointing to the problems which have plagued the Town since a couple of cultural recreation centres were established in the rural area.

Planner Ian Keith noted the amendment for Nor Halton Park would apply only to that property and with Barber's objection out of the way the Town could now implement the addition would be 38 by 23 feet. new recreation zoning controls

John Hoare's Texaco jeep was used to block they could see the smoke a mile and a half away from Acton.

When they arrived on the scene they found the Acton firefighters "had things well in hand under the direction of district chief Alf Duby." They could offer little in the way of direction or advice to the volunteers who were doing a great job and made themselves helpful doing things like adjusting hoses.

"The men (the firefighters) did a fantastic job. They all gave 110 per cent. It was sad to see them there fighting a fire at the place of business of a fellow firefighter. Lloyd McIntyre has spent 20 plus years serving his community and helping others and to have the worst happen to him makes it doubley hard."

Cunningham explained it took the firefighters 30 to 45 minutes to "gain the upper hand", to "know we would win in the battle to protect the exposures (the homes on either side)."

The fire chief said he didn't want to "sell the others short" all 22 volunteers worked so hard on the blaze, but he wanted to single out volunteer Wilf Duval for special praise. "He (Duval) took a lot of abuse, a lot of heat and smoke, protecting the exposure on the south side." The chief explained with little chance to save Thompson Fuels, all they could do was keep it contained and let the fuels burn off the main job was to make sure the fire didn't apread to the houses by keeping them wet. He noted they were fortunate the two houses weren't wood frame or they could also have been lost even with the tremendous efforts of the firefighters. It was a credit to their work that the houses suffered no water damage.

Last fall a four inch hose was introduced in Acton and Cunningham said this improvement "proved its worth in this fire."
