

Mayor taking compound issue to Police

Mayor Peter Pomeroy will raise the issue of the lack of a car compound for vehicles damaged in accidents in Acton and area at this Thursday's Halton Police Commission meeting.

The problem of cars involved in accidents being towed to Georgetown was brought to council's attention last week by Councillor Rick Bonnette and in a letter to the Town from the owner of Halton Hills Collision.

Bonnette pointed out to council Monday night that the mayor was in Acton Thursday and Friday talking to people concerned about this problem and they were satisfied Pomeroy would be taking the matter up at Police Commission.

Pomeroy said the issue had raised a big-

ger "furor" than he anticipated. He noted he talked to a number of collision shop owners, etc., about the problem of no pound in Acton and they have a "legitimate complaint."

He noted the tender called by the region for the police for towing had been changed the last time it was let and he would be raising the problems at Police Commission. He said there were "errors" made in two or three areas of the tender. He noted he will report back to council, as well as concerned business people in Acton, on the results.

Previously there was a pound and towing area for Acton as well as a pound and towing area in Georgetown.

When the tender was called last year it was for all of Halton Hills and Milton north

of 10 Sideroad and the successful bidder was Fred Tolton in Georgetown.

In reference to a report in one paper that his ears were verbally "pinned" back by the mayor and that he was reprimanded, Bonnette kidded that his ears weren't pinned back if reporters took a close look at him.

In a brief exchange last week Bonnette called the lack of a pound in Acton a "flaw" of regional government. Visibly annoyed at the comment, Pomeroy countered that the tendering process was fair and that if an Acton firm had won the contract to tow and store damaged vehicles Bonnette wouldn't be complaining. The mayor didn't feel the problem was a flaw in regional government.
