

\$1.5 million police station for Burlington

Halton region decided Wednesday to go ahead with the new \$1.5 million dollar Burlington police station, despite protests from almost half the councillors that such a move is financially irresponsible. By a close margin of 11-10, councillors voted to pass the recommendation.

Oakville Mayor Harry Barrett strongly opposed the new station because he believed it "was not financially responsible" to commit the \$1.5 million before the regional budget has been set.

"This means a one and a quarter per cent increase on the taxpayers right away," said Barrett.

But Burlington councillor James Grieve, who serves on the Police Commission, stated that the commission wanted to start the project now because interest rates are low and construction costs would be lower due to the slow down in construction.

"Object to the claim that this is irresponsible," Grieve commented. "This has been in the works for awhile."

All Halton Hills councillors except for Russ Miller, voted in favor of the police station. Dave Whiting was absent from the meeting.

In 1979, about \$90,000 was spent on

renovating the present Burlington station on Elgin Street.

"But that was just for interior cosmetic things," said Judge Joseph Seime, chairman of the board of commissioners at the recent administration and finance committee meeting.

The new, "doughnut-shaped" building will be based on the Georgetown building, only on a larger scale. A new aspect to the building, as part of the Halton police force's move towards preventative policing, is a 700 square foot room to be used by the community.

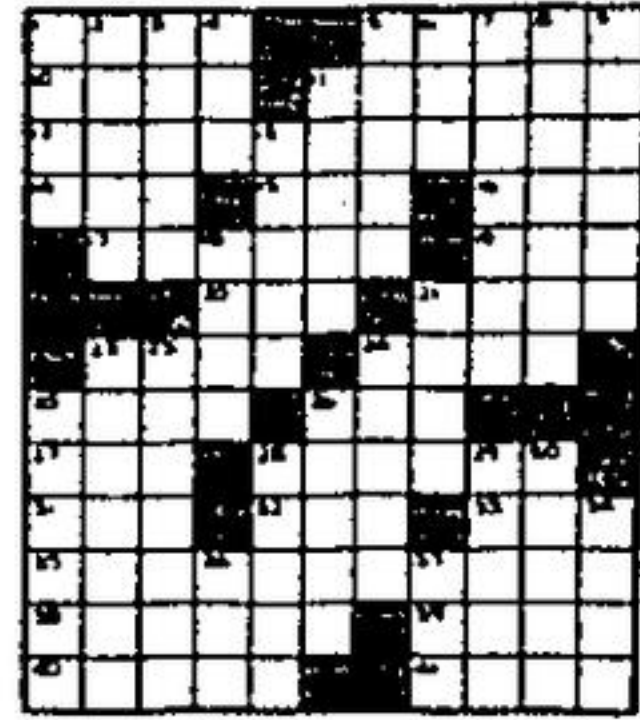
May quarry

A sandstone quarry may reopen on 9.4 hectares (23 acres) of a 120 hectare (296 acre) parcel of land between the Fifth and Sixth Lines on the north side of 17 Sideroad.

An application for the sandstone quarry has been made to the Niagara Escarpment Commission, by Ken Galbraith and Mansell Nellis, on the Vincent property formerly quarried by Credit Valley Sandstone. The operation ceased in the early 1970s.

Halton Hills council will notify the NEC they have no objection.
